Dear Judge Dougville,

We trust this letter reaches you in good health. We are reaching out to you as the parents of Ajay Gregory Pierangeli, who is presently detained due to severe charges pertaining to an accident that occurred in the early morning hours of Friday, July 28th, 2023. We are humbly requesting an alteration of his bail terms to facilitate his release.

We fully comprehend the gravity of the charges leveled against our son, and we want to assure you that our family is dedicated to ensuring his adherence to all court directives and proceedings. However, his ongoing detention is causing considerable strain on our family, both emotionally and financially.

Our son is a conscientious young man who has always been respectful of the law and authority. This is his first brush with the law, and we are confident that he deeply regrets his actions. He is appertent to rectify his mistakes and is committed to participating in any court-mandated programs as part of his rehabilitation.

We are ready to adhere to any conditions that the court may set to guarantee his presence at future court dates. This could encompass regular meetings with a court appointed official, electronic surveillance, or any other measures the court deems suitable.

Moreover, his ongoing detention is impacting his education and employment. He is a student at University of Wisconsin – Parkside studying Business, and was falling behind on program requirements for timely graduation. He also has a part time job at Buffalo's Special Pizza 2, which he risks losing. His release would enable him to continue his education and keep his job, both of which are vital for his future and rehabilitation.

We understand that the court's main priority is to ensure community safety and to ensure that our son attends all court proceedings. We assure you that we will do everything to fulfill these objectives.

We respectfully ask you to consider our appeal for a bail adjustment. We are optimistic that you will consider his prior good character, his remorse, and our family's commitment to ensuring his compliance with all court orders.

Thank you for your time and consideration. We trust in the justice system and are confident that a fair and equitable decision will be reached.

I am writing this letter on behalf of Ajay Pierangeli, my cousin, who is facing very serious charges with the potential result of a substantial prison sentence.

I was deeply saddened to hear the news of this tragic accident, which led to the deaths of both Jenna Barrette and Dylan Zamora, serious physical and psychological injuries to Alex Wajersky and Ajay as well as serious psychological impact to Quincy Hanson. On behalf of our family, our deepest condolences and prayers go out to the families and friends of all involved in this horrific tragedy. I simply cannot imagine the immense pain Jenna and Dylan's families continue to go through daily and pray for their healing during this most difficult time.

It is with the utmost respect for the gravity of this situation and its impact on all involved in this terrible accident that I reach out to you directly to ask for your compassionate and merciful evaluation of Ajay's current cash bond of \$500,000 with the humble request to modify the cash condition of his bond to a lesser signature amount. This modification may allow our family to come up with the means to bring Ajay home during this interim period as we anxiously await the next steps of the legal process, while ensuring his adherence to all other conditions of release outlined by the court on 22 Aug 2023.

Ajay has suffered enormous pain both physically and mentally over these past months, with the learning of the deaths of two of his closest friends, Jenna and Dylan, and serious injuries to Alex and Quincy no doubt being the most difficult of all he has had to endure. Allowing Ajay to come home, under electronic monitoring, would provide an environment for Ajay to better heal and strengthen himself for the tough road ahead. Ajay is an incredible young man who loves his family and friends unconditionally, has been a trusted and active contributor to our beautiful community here in Kenosha, and has always strived to be the best version of himself and will undoubtedly continue to do so in whatever direction his young life takes him.

I humbly bring you this request not to excuse Ajay's actions in the early hours of July 28th, 2023, but to seek the ever-slight lift of the incredible burden Ajay carries and will continue to carry for the rest of his life, being at home could provide during this interim period. This was an unintentional, terrible, terrible accident; no one in that car that night deserved the unfathomable nightmarish outcomes this accident caused, including Ajay.

Ajay is a beautiful human being, the remorse he experiences every minute of every day is truly unmeasurable.

Family units are proven to be the primary source of financial and accommodation support when an individual with a brain injury moves back into normality and begins to renegotiate their social world. Regarding the loss of his two best friends, families are vital and absolutely necessary throughout the grieving process. The family of Ajay Pierangeli is intentional about supporting him through unimaginable pain and they can provide the utmost emotional contribution after such a tragic event.

I kindly request that the court reconsider the bond conditions for Ajay Pierangeli in light of his character and the undue hardship that the current conditions are causing him. I believe that modification to the bond terms, taking into account Ajay Pierangeli's specific circumstances and willingness of compliance, would better serve the interests of justice while allowing him to return to our community and contribute positively.

My name is Ethan Ficker, and I am a college student in Minnesota. I am writing on behalf of my best friend, Ajay Pierangeli, to request that he receive a bail modification. The bail modification hearing is scheduled for 10/27/2023.

I respect that Ajay has been found guilty, but I am writing to give you a fuller picture of Ajay. I have known Ajay since 2nd grade and have grown up with him through high school. In these last four years, I have been in college, Ajay and I have kept in touch. Every time I come home to visit, he is the first one to ask if I want to get together to catch up and hang out. Ajay continuously checks in to see how I am doing and wishes not only me but my whole family happy birthday, happy Mother's Day, happy Father's Day, and any other holiday. I have stayed up on multiple occasions talking to him about personal issues I have struggled with, and he has been there for me. He would listen to me and try to be there for me. Ajay has been there for me more times than I can count, and I am not sure I would be at this point in my life without him.

When we were younger, we always hung out at each other's houses or went to the Elementary School to play pick-up basketball. Every day in elementary school, one of us had a note to give to the bus driver so we could get off at the other's house. I remembered Ajay's home phone number because I had called it many times when I was younger. I was not the most outgoing child when I was younger, but that never bothered Ajay; he would always invite me along and make me feel included. We drifted apart in middle and high school, but I always knew he would be there if I needed him.

Ajay had talked to me about returning to school either this year or next because he had taken time off to work after transferring back home from UW-La Crosse. He had expressed interest in going to school for a

teaching or business degree. I could see him going into teaching because he worked at the Boys & Girls Club in town, where he mentored the younger children and would be an adult figure for them. He would constantly tell me about how much he enjoyed spending time at work with those children because he not only helped them, but they also helped him. He cared a lot about younger children and wanted to be a good influence on them, especially his nephew. Ajay told me so much about his nephew, how much he enjoyed spending time with him, and how much his nephew looked up to him. It was not a difficult decision for me because he had always been there in the past and hopefully in the future. Without him in my life, I would lose a safety blanket and a part of myself because I have confided so much to him in the 15 years I have known him. He has been my connection to many friends back home while I have been at college. Whenever I would hang out with him, there would be other friends that I would not have typically seen, which I have always been grateful for. Ajay has also kept me grounded more times than I count because when it came to sports, I would play 110%, and it would be the one time I would do something based on emotions and not logic. Therefore, some decisions I would make were not my best judgment, and I would put myself in harm's way, but Ajay was there to make me take a step back and think about what I was doing.

Thank you for your time and consideration, and I ask for a bail modification on behalf of Ajay so he can rest at home and spend time with his family. I am available to be contacted if you have any questions.

little league baseball. As Ajay grew up
he was on highschool basketball. He
was very popular with his friends. He
not only cared about them deeply, but
loved them and his family with his
whole heart.

A.J. is my son's role model.
Cal (my son) and A.J. are like brothers.
Cal always wanted to take A.J. on
vacations, including Orlando Florida →

My name is Rebecca Infusino, and I am Ajay Pierangeli's aunt. I am writing to request and for you to strongly consider a modification for his bond. Ajay is currently awaiting trial in your court with appearance on October 27, 2023. Please know that I have a lot of respect for the court and for all involved in this tragic accident. This has not been easy on any of the families/parties involved and our community.

Ajay is one year younger than my oldest son and they grew up very closely together. Please allow me to introduce you to Ajay. He is one of the most soft-spoken, well-mannered, sweetest, kindest, and most gentle young man I know. He is a very caring young man who works hard. My son recommended him to work alongside him at Ruffalo's 2 when they needed help knowing how much of a hard worker, responsible and someone the owners could count on.

Knowing how much care and compassion Ajay has, it was no surprise that he then took on another job while still working at Ruffalo's at the Boys and Girls Club in Kenosha helping to mentor and influence young kids in the community who need to be seen, cared for, taught and mentored.

Ajay along with many other extended family members, families, friends, and this community is going to have to live with this tragic mistake for the rest of our lives. His physical injuries were very severe and are still not completely healed. His emotional and mental state is fragile and with a reduction in bail he would be able to get the support from his family and medical attention that he will need for the long term.

Both Ajay and his family knows the consequences for this tragic accident and are not dismissing the severity of this accident, or the possible outcome. However, I am asking you to consider that he made a huge mistake and to better prepare for this outcome, reducing his bail with strict conditions will help in this undertaking.

Thank you for your time and consideration of this bail modification at this time. I am happy to speak on his behalf live if needed as well and answer any questions on his character.
