You are not to come on to district property or have contact with anyone from the district other than Ms. Gina Greil, Principal of Brompton or me.

While you are on paid administrative leave, you will be required to make yourself available during your regularly scheduled work hours and to respond to questions and/or act as a resource for your department in the event they require assistance from you as directed by Ms. Greil.

You are instructed to keep this matter confidential and are directed not to discuss the details of your paid administrative leave with anyone unless directed by Ms. Greil or me.

Mr. Gallo.

You are being issued disciplinary action pursuant to Board Policy 4362 regarding your racial charged remarks towards a student in your class on 1/30/2024.

During an interview with the Office of Human Resources, you admitted to telling a student of origin that his hair looked like "moss", and that he should "go hang out with his parents on the north side of a tree". Then in order to make your point, you said in your written statement that you told the student that "You'll be reincarnated as moss to the north side of a brick wall". "To exercise even more intelligence, more clever wit", your words, you told the student "Yeah, your friends and family called, they're on the north side of a brick wall" You made these comments because you said you try to connect to your students by "roasting" them in order for you to develop trust on their level.

There is clear lack of judgment in your choice of words and how you attempted respond to a student's apparent insult at you. As the teacher and adult in the class it is expected that exercise sound judgment when engaging in banter with students that could lead to discriminatory comments. While you may not have meant your comments to be discriminatory in nature, all of the students in your class viewed your comments as race based.

Of most concern is that this is not your first incident regarding racially charged comments. On 1/20/2020, you were issued a 3-day unpaid suspension for insensitive comments you made to your class. It was alleged that you made comments to the effect that you had a personal pet peeve against overweight individuals and that you wondered why they did not simply go to the gym. It was alleged that you stated that you do a double take when you see an African American on the golf course. You admitted to telling "mom" jokes to your students in class. For these actions you received a 3-day unpaid suspension and were required to complete the following class, "Sensitivity Skills in a Diverse Workplace". You were also cautioned that any further failure to meet expectations and / or follow District policies could result in further disciplinary action up to and including a recommendation to the Board of Education for contract non-renewal and / or termination.

On 11/27/2023, you were issued a written warning for telling a student that "If you're so proud of your country then go back to that country", in response to the question "Should you be able to fly a flag from a different country", asked by a female student of heritage. The student expressed that she was proud

to be of decent, even though she was not born in flying state 's flag then go back to state '.

You are found to be in violation of the following Kenosha Unified School District Policies and Employee Handbook rules:

- 1. KUSD Board Policy 4111 Employee Anti-Harassment
- 2. KUSD Board Policy 6810 Teaching about Controversial Issues
- 3. KUSD Employee Handbook, Section 1: Employment, Anti-harassment
- 4. KUSD Employee Handbook, Section 7: Employee Conduct, Code of Ethics and Disciplinary Action, General Rules of Conduct
 - a. #7 Fighting, horseplay, or use of profane, obscene or abusive language toward any manager, employee or student.
 - b. #11 Refusing to comply with District policies and procedures and/or carry out the instructions of a supervisor.
 - c. #21 Any act of harassment, sexual, racial or other towards anyone; telling sexist or racial-type jokes, making racial or ethnic slurs.

As a staff member of the Kenosha Unified School District, you are expected to interact respectfully, safely, professionally with students. As such you are required to adhere to the District's standards of professionalism and polices as outlined in the KUSD Employee Handbook and School Board Policy.

In accordance with the discipline process outlined in the KUSD Employee Handbook, Section 7: Employee Conduct, Code of Ethics and Disciplinary Action, your employment with KUSD is being terminated effective immediately.

Statement: Classroom allegation 1-30-24

I met with Mr. Gallo at approximately 11:20 a.m. Tuesday January 1st, 2024. When he came in I asked him to sit down and to close the door. I stated that I needed to talk to him about and the comment he allegedly made about the student being reincarnated on the north side of the wall). Mr. Gallo immediately started to describe the classroom and the craziness of the boys and I told him that I was not interested in that and that I was interested in what he said and why he said it. He then said "you have to understand the class to understand what I said" and I replied "no I don't, you're the adult in the classroom and what you say is the important piece". I explained to him that I have multiple students telling me that "you asked if he was reincarnated on the north side of the wall". He said no "I told him his family was on the north side of trees". I asked him if he ever said "the brick wall" and he sald no, I said "trees ask the kids". I said "I have but I want to know why?" He said because that's where moss grows. I said yes, but why would you say that to him?". He said that "he called me a bowling ball referring to my baldness, so I compared him to moss". I said why? At this point, Mr. Gallo paused after a few moments he said because his "hair is fuzzy". I then replied with, "you know that he is seed and he said yes. So then I asked "why would you then pull up a picture of moss and tell him that this was his family? He said "to create a culture in his class he tries to use their language and if he is going to throw an insult.....(shoulder shrug)*. At this point I asked him about this being perceived as racial and that's when he got visibly agitated. He stated that "this class will make everything about race or something sexual" and asked me why am I believing a bunch of graders? I told him that "I will always give a teacher the benefit of the doubt, but every kid that I have talked to has said that you said this and the perception is that you were referring to his race". Mr. Gallo was very agitated at this point and was upset that I was listening to the graders. He said a couple of times that they are "running the school". He asked me to ask the good kids in the class and not the ones that are making this claim. I asked him for names and then told him that I already spoke to a few of them. I read one response to him and told him that I will make sure to ask everyone in the class (I only had 10 responses at the time). He shook his head in disbellef and continued with the kids running the school. I interrupted him and said "listen, regardless of what you intended you are the adult and the professional in the classroom. This behavior of going back and forth with kids is not okay". He was adamant that he had to act like them to create a culture and I said numerous times "absolutely not, you are the adult and the professional". I ended our conversation with the following "and when you don't act in this matter we end up here just like we did with warm. He said "I'm not going to sit and argue" and I said "you're, right because I'm not going to have any teacher tell me that they do not have to act like an adult and a professional in my building. You can grab your things and head home for today, jYou will be on paid leave while I finish the investigation". He sat in my office for alfew minutes silently before he got up and left. 1/31/24

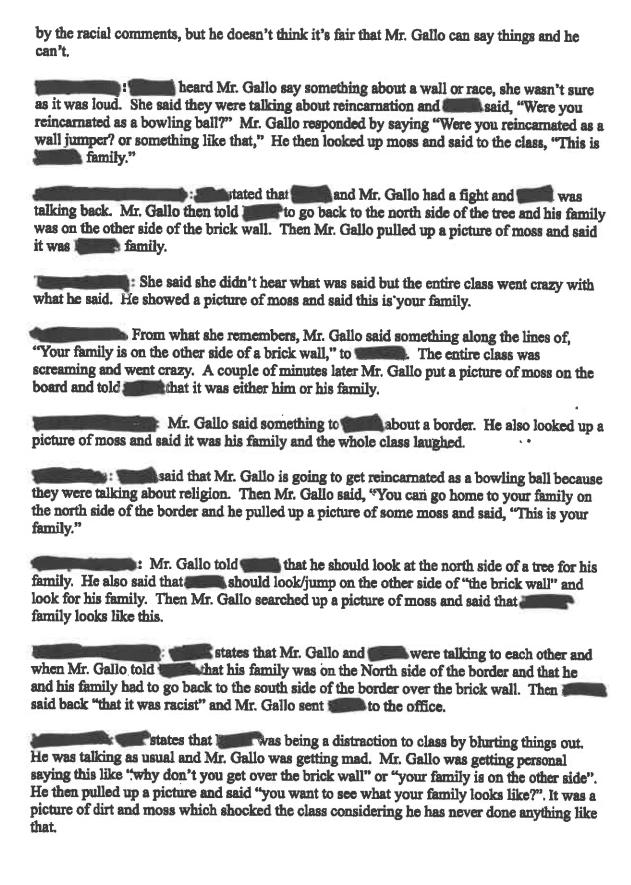
At approximately 10:00 a.m. Tuesday morning January 30th. Mr. Gallo sent a grade
student (student) to the office for being disruptive in class.
He called and told the secretary to have him sit for 10 minutes before returning.

discussion another student in the class stated something about being reincarnated as a bug.
So he in turn told him that, "He should be reincarnated as a bowling ball," (Mr. Gallo is

the south side of the border?" He also stated that, "Mr. Gallo says racist things a lot." At this

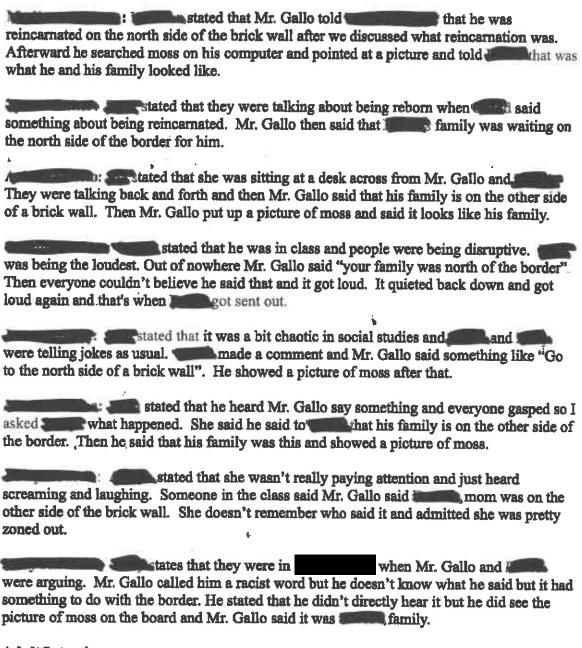
Investigation

The investigation includes written statements and an interview with 23 students and two staff members (exhibits 1-23). Three of the students interviewed do not have a written statement as they were busy working on classwork and did not pay attention to what was happening. Each of these 3 students acknowledged the "gasps" in the class and loudness at one point. They all mentioned a picture of moss on the board and the teacher stating "this is your family" to to student names were redacted from their statement because their father called and asked that they are not included.

Student Interviews:

Hello Again,

After a really long night, thinking about how badly I put my 'foot in my mouth' or 'stepped in it,' I can provide more info to the best of my memory-

Class had just finished a quick video clip on 'Untouchables' in Indian culture and some notes on Religions in Ancient India, with about 20 minutes left in class. I had been redirecting the boys significantly the whole time, more deliberately than usual, even moving their seats around again. Getting more firm with this group has been a trend for the second semester because their behavior is so blatant and so inappropriate and so disruptive to the flow of class. So, for days I've been grinding class to a halt very awkwardly.

Anyway, was the most relentless, again continuing to be disrespectful and defiant. Eventually he muttered something like "Gallo, you'll be reincarnated as a bowling ball," referencing my hairdo. By this point, the boys had been having fun with this concept of reincarnation, so I said back to referencing his hairdo, "You'll be reincarnated as some moss on the north side of a tree," trying to make the analogy to moss funny and gain some access into to their fierce click.

But, at this point, I felt and and the class weren't getting the reference to where moss grows, so I said, "You'll be reincarnated as moss to the north side of a brick wall." Both places grow moss very well, by the way. Then, to exercise even more intelligence, more clever wit, and more 'look who's in charge here,' I said "Yeah your friends and family called, they're on the north side of a brick wall" as I was implying he should join all the other moss.

I never thought about, nor had any intention of this being turned into some racial, migration situation, but that's just what a number of these boys have been doing daily, all the time, negatively influencing class, turning each and every situation into a sexual or racial or 'you name it' kind of joke.

We had a detailed conversation about how your instruction as an educator violated School Board Policy 6810: Teaching about Controversial Topics and School Board Policy 4111: Employee Anti-Harassment. Policy 6810 states, "For those approved topics which may involve controversial issues, study and discussion of such issues shall be objective and impartial and within the appropriate context of a District course of study." Your comment, "If you are so proud of your flag then go back to your country," was not objective or impartial and directly insulted this student who is proud of her the heritage. Policy 4111 explicitly states that any "offensive, threatening or derogatory comments to any person, either directly or indirectly, based on the person's membership in any protected class is prohibited." While the intent of your comment was to teach the First Amendment, you inadvertently made a student uncomfortable because of her heritage.

After our discussion I understood what you were trying to do in class but as we discussed it is important that you remain impartial when teaching about controversial topics. As a staff member within Kenosha Unified School District, you are expected to interact respectfully, safely, professionally with students. As such, you are required to adhere to the District's standards of professionalism and polices as outlined in the KUSD Employee Handbook and School Board Policy.

If you are ever in need to talk through a lesson prior to teaching it, please seek out our instructional coach or myself to support your lesson.

This letter serves as written discipline and will be placed in your personnel file in Kenosha Unified School District's Human Resource Office.

Background

On Monday afternoon November 20, 2023 came to the office to report that her teacher
(Mr. Gallo) said that "if you're so proud of your country then go back to your country" in response to the
question "should you be able to fly a flag from a different country".

He then repeated if you are flying got upset by his
comments and left the classroom. I had write a statement (exhibit A). Before I could start to
investigate Mr. Gallo's comments in class he walked into my office. I explained to him that I would be
starting an investigation about his comments to see what really happened. I asked if there was truth to
what shared and Mr. Gallo admitted that he said it. He explained that he said it because he was
trying to show how the 1st amendment works (that is what he is currently teaching in class). I explained
to him that regardless of the topic and it being "tough to teach" (his words) as an educator you are not
allowed to impose your opinions as it relates to controversial issues (policy 6810). I also explained that
while the 1st amendment is not a controversial issue, the words he spoke to the entire class was because
it takes a political tone. I asked Mr. Gallo to write a statement (exhibit B). I then reached out to my
supervisor (to ask if I needed to continue to investigate if the teacher admitted to the
allegation and she said no.

On Tuesday November 21, 2023 I received an email (exhibit C) from stating Mr. Gallo engaged the class in discussion about legal or illegal rights. His student was upset by the conversation and it has occurred in the past as well.

Investigation

The Investigation was cut short due to the teacher coming to my office and admitting what he said in class.

Student witness: Same to the office Monday afternoon very upset. She stated that her teacher Mr. Gallo was making racial comments and that he shouldn't be allowed to say these things in class. She said that he was telling the class that he is sick of people flying their countries' flag and if they love it so much that they should go back. She ended up arguing with him and then left the classroom.

Conclusion: I had a conversation with Mr. Gallo about teaching controversial topics and using examples of controversial issues in his class. I pointed out school board policy 6810 and explained why this incident goes against this policy. Mr. Gallo had a hard time understanding why what he said was not o.k. At one point he stated "so I am not allowed to have any opinions ever?". To which I responded that he can have as many opinions as he wants however, as an educator he can not impose his beliefs on his students and cannot allow students to believe he feels one way or another. He continued to say that he was trying to meet kids at their level in explaining the 1st amendment. I responded that his statement was not necessary for teaching the 1st amendment and that his statement was imposing his beliefs on his students and was rather hurtful. I explained that he instantly created a divide in his class by sharing his opinion and that his statement was borderline bullying/harassment based on race (policy 4111). We continued the discussion and eventually landed in a good place. He knows that he was out of line and let his frustrations with this one student get the best of him.

Recommendation

Mr. Gallo is learning to work with middle school students and has been doing a great job. We discussed ways he could teach his content and protect himself. I reiterated that he is allowed to have his own beliefs but that he needs to stick to teaching the content and not sharing his beliefs. I asked him to review the policy (6810 and 4111) and to be sure to check with me if he has a lesson planned that may create friction in the future.

Teaching the First Amendment

Hi,

Teaching the First Amendment is not only one of the most impassioned subjects of KUSD curriculum but also one of the most important in explaining who we are as a country and as a people. It is a corner stone of our ideals. And, origins of the United States hinge upon documents such as the Bill of Rights and Constitution. They inform us daily on what directions to take.

Yesterday's lesson was a follow up to a wildly enjoyed game called 'Do I Have a Right' inspired by former Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Conner and the amazing resources created by <u>icivics.org</u>. To continue emphasizing and defining our 'rights' I cautiously introduced more difficult subject matter, for example yelling 'fire' in a theater, burning American flags, burning crosses, calling for the overthrow of our government, student free speech in schools, and even the right of the KKK to have a rally.

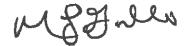
All of this is essential to proving how opinionated people are allowed to get, while the law still protects them. Understanding this is crucial to understanding what our country stands for. And, careful discussions of this nature are necessary to illuminate our freedoms, shining light on the difficult to see grey areas that confuse many of us. It is not an easy discussion but a necessary one. We must continue studying these concepts.

So, most of this process went well, and then it did not. When discussing the subject of flags, I inserted a personal opinion. I do not usually offer personal opinions but students many times expect real life experiences. Ironically, on numerous occasions has pointedly asked me if I have any experience in 'the matter'. Starting slowly to explain my perspective, I mentioned how smaller flags displayed in car windows do not bother me; I obviously respect people having pride in their heritage. But, what I do not respect, as stated in class, is people flying larger flags driving down the road. Following discussions from earlier, this was my opinion, but I explained, they still have the right. I also stated that it was my opinion, maybe they were in the wrong country if they were flying such a big flag, but that they do have the right.

This comment brought gasps and whispers and emotions and an argument with my eyes, she changed the civil nature of the discussion, demonizing me, stirring up the class, and creating a hostile environment for discussing any further ideas. In an authoritative voice, I addressed her argument and tone to no avail. She would not have any further discussions. Unfortunately, a motivation and goal in presenting this lesson was to engage students in a civil discourse. Though, I am still learning the maturity level of middle schoolers has its limits, I am

undeterred in trying to practice discussions like this in the safety of a school. It is to prepare future citizens for a vocal, opinionated society.

Dear Mr. Gallo:

As you know, we have been investigating reports that were made to your building administrators on or around November 26, 2019.

On the aforementioned date, several students from your class expressed discomfort about some of the examples you had shared when discussing the unit on prejudice. For example, it was alleged that you made comments to the effect that you had a personal pet peeve against overweight individuals and that you wondered why they did not simply go to the gym. Additionally, in another example, it was alleged that you stated that you do a double take when you see an African American on the golf course.

In addition to the examples that you shared of your personal biases, multiple students reported that you regularly make "mom jokes." Specifically, it was alleged that you have said things like, "That's not what your mom said last night."

As part of the investigative process, your building administrators interviewed over 30 students and the above allegations were confirmed by many.

On December 9, 2019, you met with Human Resources to discuss the allegations against you. You admitted to sharing the examples of your personal biases as described above, but expressed that you believed it to be appropriate in the context of the class. You acknowledged that you did not give any thought to the potential that some of the very students you were attempting to teach could find your comments offensive, thus defeating the purpose of the lesson. You also admitted that you do sometimes tell "mom jokes" but that you did not intend to attach any sexual connotation to said jokes. Finally, you stated that you sometimes find yourself behaving in a similar manner to the young teens that you instruct, which you know is inappropriate.

Based on the District's investigation, it is clear that the examples you shared of your personal biases demonstrated a lack of cultural sensitivity. Also, your general behavior when interacting with students is does not demonstrate the level of maturity and professionalism required for your role. Your behavior does not meet the standards of professional responsibilities as outlined in the Educator Effectiveness Evaluation Instrument.













As a result of your actions and pursuant to District Policy 4362 – Employee Discipline, you are hereby being placed on a 3-day unpaid disciplinary suspension. Your 3-day unpaid disciplinary suspension will be counted from Wednesday, January 8 to Friday, January 10, 2020. You will return to regular work on Monday, January 13, 2020.

In an effort to support you in meeting the expected standards of performance and behavior, the District will be assigning you a mentor for the remainder 2020 calendar year. We have identified Mr. Che Kearby, Coordinator of Social Studies/Educator Effectiveness, to support you in this capacity. Please contact Mr. Kearby by Friday, January 17, 2020, to set up an initial meeting and develop a plan. You will also be paired with an instructional coach to complete a student centered coaching cycle. Both the mentorship and the partnership with the instructional coach will be overseen and monitored by your principal.

Finally, we are requiring that you complete the Sensitivity Skills in a Diverse Workplace training offered by MRA on Thursday, April 30, 2020, in Waukesha, WI. The following are the learning objectives of the course:

- Recognize the impact of actions upon others, the organization, and the individual.
- Differentiate between behaviors that are appropriate or inappropriate and perhaps illegal.
- Describe what constitutes cultural competence and cultural incompetence.
- Use skills in communicating across cultures.
- Identify action steps needed to value others in the workplace.

Details on this course can be found on the MRA website at https://www.mranet.org/Training-Events/Training/Sensitivity-Skills-in-a-Diverse-Workplace. KUSD will cover the cost of this training and will make arrangements for a substitute teacher to cover your absence.

Please note that any further failure to meet expectations and/or follow District policies will result in further disciplinary action up to and including a recommendation to the Board of Education for contract non-renewal and/or termination of employment.

We hope that this discipline will allow you the opportunity to reflect on your practices as a teacher and your continued employment with the District.

Background

On November 26, 2019 Assistant Principal Lauren Johnson informed Principal Steve Knecht of two student complaints regarding teacher, Mr. Marcus Gallo. The complaints accused Mr. Gallo of being inappropriate with his word choices and sharing too much of his personal life/opinions with all students in class. Additionally, it was reported that Mr. Gallo makes crude jokes, at times referring to mothers, during class). In both class settings, the students are becoming more uncomfortable and tired of his comments. In their own words, both students felt Mr. Gallo has been unprofessional in many aspects of his teaching and verbal interactions with students. Additionally, the students were concerned with Mr. Gallo's lack of content rigor and non-engaging lessons.

Also, on November 26, 2019 Assistant Principal Lauren Johnson discussed the student concerns with Mr. Marcus Gallo. During their conversation it was reported that Mr. Gallo found the information to be exaggerated. His intentions were to be honest with the students, believing that individuals can learn from each other when honesty about personal prejudice are discussed. Mr. Gallo did not dispute the allegations disclosed by the students submitting the original complaints. Mr. Gallo was asked to write and submit a personal statement regarding the discussed student concerns. (See Appendix II: Staff Statements)

On November 27, 2019 Assistant Principal Lauren Johnson Individually Interviewed both students making the initial complaint. Both students had similar concerns including the following:

- o Mr. Gallo shared his personal preconceptions with the class that he is:
 - prejudiced against overweight people
 - sees overweight people and doesn't understand why they don't go to the gym
 - surprised when he sees a person of color (African American) on a golf course
- Additional concerns related to the overall course and class environment
 - Mr. Gallo spends too much time during class talking about other personal experiences and stories that are unrelated to the class topic. At times these conversations can seem unethical to have with students.
 - Mr. Gallo giving class assignments that have little value, meaning or explanation.
 <u>Course seems like a waste of time.</u>
- Mr. Gallo jokes with students to the point of becoming unprofessional. On several occasions, the jokes have been related to students' mothers.

On November 29th, Principal Steve Knecht sent an email to the following individuals informing them of the student complaint and a possible personnel issue.

- Maxceen Augustus, Employee Relations Coordinator
- Lindsey O'Connor, Chief Human Resource Officer
- Sue Valeri, Chief of School Leadership
- Brian Geiger, Regional Coordinator for Leadership and Learning Secondary

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- Cliff Johnson, Assistant Principal Tremper High School
- Lauren Johnson, Assistant Principal Tremper High School
- Michelle Santelli, Assistant Principal Tremper High School

It was determined at this time that Mr. Marcus Gallo would be placed on paid leave until a formal investigation was completed. Principal Steve Knecht informed Mr. Gallo of this determination via a phone conversation on Sunday, December 1, 2019 at 10:56am.

On December 2, 2019 Assistant Principal Michelle Santelli was asked to begin a formal investigation. With the advisement of Ms. Maxceen Augustus, it was determined that all students enrolled in Mr. Gallo's Ethnic Studies class and Check & Connect would be interviewed.

Investigation

From December 2 - December 5, 2019, Assistant Principal Michelle Santelli talked with 38 students. All 37 were able to provide a written statement. (All written statements can be found in Appendix I: Student Statement section of this summary.) Similar questions were asked to all students interviewed. It has been determined that there are several common threads found throughout all of the student statements, including (but not limited to):

- 1. Mr. Gallo is fun and friendly with all his students.
- 2. Mr. Gallo jokes around with everyone, especially in Check and Connect.
- 3. least a lot of joking going on.
- 4. Executive an honors level should include learning and discussions on race and ethnicity with a focus on experiences and perspectives of others.
- 5. Mr. Gallo allows for student voice to be heard even in class debates with strong opposing views.
- 6. Mr. Gallo is respectful in listening to others.
- 7. Mr. Gallo often brings his own experiences and personal points-of-view into class discussions.
- 8. Mr. Gallo is very open about his viewpoints.
- 9. Mr. Gallo has stated his personal, prejudice options regarding overweight individuals and seeing persons of color (African Americans) on the golf course.

Several students stated that the personal examples Mr. Gallo shared in the classroom were relevant to the discussions in class, even though the statements may be viewed as preconceived opinions. Likewise, some students expressed that Mr. Gallo always makes sure the class fully understand the context of the discussion, and they do not feel offended or uncomfortable during class discussions even with Mr. Gallo's personal examples being shared.

During the course of the investigation additional information was told by students (direct quotes from written statements)

- Gallo in a lesson about prejudice said, "I have a prejudice against fat people or overweight people. I
 have always been small or skinny, so I don't get how you can be fat." (Student statement #1)
- Since Mr. Gallo is a golf coach...he said, "If you show up to the golf course and there's a couple of African Americans you may be like wow or be a little surprised, right?" (Student statement #1)
- He made fun of my attire one day. I was wearing yellow crocs and rubber duck socks. He berated me and my attire for quite awhile, and was confused when I was also upset the next day. (Student statement #2)
- I wish he would give us something to really challenge us without the classroom getting to heated.
 (Student statement #5)

- There have been certain jokes made consistently that I have written off as "just Gallo being himself" because it was C&C. (Student statement #7)
- He also struggles with curriculum and lesson planning and seems to often try to plan lessons as class starts. (Student statement #7)
- He is truly one of my favorite teachers. (Student statement #9)
- He just throws random assignments at us with no explanation. Student statement #11)
- I felt like they didn't care what they were saying about certain topics and I was like the only African American person in there. He never really asked me if I felt okay with the things he was saying our talking about. (Student Statement #13)
- I feel as if Mr. Gallo has violated a lot of professionalism in the past, and that his perspectives and treatment of some matters are completely irresponsible. (Student statement #14)
- We have had many conversations in the past about prejudice, but any comments he has made were put in context to relate to the relevant topics in our class. (Student statement #18)
- This makes me feel uncomfortable because my mom is overweight and I know they have worked together before and it bothers me to think that he thinks about that when working with her. (Student statement #20)
- He stated that he gets surprised when he sees "black" people at certain places in public like a golf course. (Student statement #21)
- The class is very laid back and he seems to want to be more friends with his students rather than a teacher. (Student statement #25)
- I felt as if Gallo opened up the opportunity for my voice to be heard and listened to. (Student statement #27)
- Gallo then shared how he does not understand the way people get to be obese to the point where they die from it. I don't understand where the issue is in him stating his own personal belief. (Student statement #27)
- I have heard him make jokes pertaining to mothers. He has never said it in an insulting way or anything inappropriate. (Student statement #30)

All written statements and other collected documentation is included in this summary.

Recommendation

After speaking with Principal Steve Knecht, the recommendation is that a conversation be had between Administration at Tremper and KUSD's Human Resource Department to determine next steps. Tremper Administration, specifically Mr. Knecht, does not have the background on District past precedent nor does he have enough experience in cases such as this.

HR INVESTIGATION - WRITTEN BY MAXCEEN AUGUSTUS

Marcus has been with the District for 10 years and is currently a	teacher at Tremper.
He explained that this is his first year teaching	
including race, culture, heritage, immigration and prejudices and discrimination.	Marcus was assigned to teach
the course this year because of his certification to teach AP Social Studies and bec	
was unable to continue teaching it. Marcus feels that the class is going really well	and that he has been
receiving positive feedback from students. He acknowledged that it has been chal	lenging work to develop
assignments for the class, but he finds it rewarding.	

Marcus stated that he had been put on leave due to some recent student concerns. He said that prior to being placed on leave, he was given a list of quotes about comments that he had allegedly said and was asked to respond to them. The first example we discussed was the one in which it was alleged that Marcus said that he has a pet peeve about overweight people and wonders why they do not join a gym.

Marcus described it as a lingering prejudice. He explained that there are studies that show that everyone has prejudices and that prejudices are based on irrational judgements. He decided to put himself out there by starting the discussion with an example of one of his personal prejudices. He explained to the students that he does not date overweight females and is not attracted to them. When asked how many times he has shared this example, he said that it was only once. He added that when he made the comment that he had a pet peeve against overweight people, he followed up by saying that some people might ask why obese people don't go to the gym. That is because they do not understand genetics or family culture. Marcus stated that he was just reinforcing that prejudice is often irrational. Later in our conversation, Marcus acknowledged that sometime around Thanksgiving, he again made comments about his feelings concerning overweight women. He admitted that he said something to the effect that he should be more thankful for big girls because he could get more dates. I asked Marcus if he was aware of any overweight students in the class. He said he does not really pay attention. I asked if he considered how such comments could potentially be perceived as body shaming to fragile teenage girls who struggle with weight and body image concerns and he responded by saying that he did not take that into consideration when sharing his personal prejudice. I asked Marcus if he had ever worked with the mother of one of the girls in his class and he confirmed that at one point he worked mother and admitted that in his perception, the woman in question could be with ! overweight. He stated that he did not give any thought to how might feel. He just thought that by being honest about his own biases, he was making students more comfortable to share theirs.

Next, we discussed Marcus' comments about his surprise when seeing black people on the golf course. Marcus said that he was talking about his personal biases. He went on to share that the same thing happens when groups of Korean players show up on the golf course. People do a double take. Marcus said that he discusses many examples using different ethnicities and he does that in an attempt to be fair and balanced. I questioned whether Marcus thought of presenting the topics using a different approach. He said he did not think about that. There is currently one American/biracial student in Marcus' class. There were the other students of color but they both dropped the class. One cited scheduling conflicts and the other said she was uncomfortable with the class and that she was also struggling with the honors load of work. Marcus said that he makes the remaining student of color feel included in the class, but could not specifically explain how he

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achieves that goal, except to say that he uses examples from all aspects of life and does not include bias examples.

I asked Marcus about a report that he had told students not to bring kool aid to class for an activity because he was told by some students that it is racist toward black people to bring kool aid to an event. He told students that he would do some further research on the matter. Marcus did not say whether or not he followed up with the results of his research, but stated that the students did not end up bringing the beverage.

I mentioned to Marcus that there was a common theme in the student statement indicating that a lot of joking goes on in Marcus' classroom. Marcus admitted that he likes to use humor. He explained that he does take his lessons and tasks seriously, but that he teaches mostly graders and there is a lot of "roasting" or "gunning" or banter back and forth. I questioned Marcus specifically about the "mom jokes." He explained that he makes Jokes about dating students' moms. For example, when a student asked him whom he was bringing to homecoming, Marcus said, "your mom." He added that the mom jokes are mostly about "dating stuff." He thinks the jokes are funny and only slightly inappropriate. He denies saying, "That's not what your mom said last night." I asked Marcus to explain why he considered these jokes to be acceptable. After some thought, he agreed that the jokes were in bad taste but said that it was part of the roasting culture. Marcus said he is very aware of certain boundaries but maybe not entirely. He stated that because he spends so much time with students, he finds himself behaving like them at times.

Marcus said that he treats male and female students equally and engages with everyone based on their willingness to participate in the lesson. He thinks that the girls in are overall more vocal and more engaged in the conversations. According to Marcus, he prepares daily lesson plans and stores them in Google classroom and denies any allegation from students that he does not come prepared to class. He admitted that the remaining chapters of the course syllabus have been divided up among the students and that each group will teach about a topic. His role will be to facilitate things and add clarification or missing information. He said that he believed this approach would be more engaging for senior students instead of having him being the one lead the class the entire time. He denied that he has assigned the work to the students because he does not want to do it himself. This was in light of an earlier comment that Marcus made, saying that preparing assignments for the course has been challenging.

According to a student statement, a group once completed a project and Marcus commented that he was surprised that they had gotten it done considering that they were going in different directions in their personal lives. He explained that there were some students with family problems and attendance issues and what he meant was that he was proud that everyone had pulled together. He did not consider this comment to be insensitive or unnecessary. In his mind, he was giving the group a compliment.

Toward the end of the meeting, we again discussed the mom jokes. I told Marcus that I found the practice concerning. He apologized and said that that was the only thing he acknowledged that was wrong. He said that sometimes if he considers a joke to be PG enough, he will tell it even if it crosses the line a little bit. I explained to Marcus that the District has a policy (4111) that prohibits sexual jokes or jokes with sexual connotation. He did not agree that there was any sexual connotation to his "mom jokes." I further explained that I was concerned that by sharing personal examples of his biases, he had not given any thought to the possible

emotional impact to students in the room. Marcus explained that he uses personal examples a lot and tries not to use the same ones over and over. He does this because he believes that personal examples have an impact on students because they are fascinated with the lives of their teachers.

We concluded by discussing next steps. Marcus expressed concern about not knowing who his accusers were and requested that we talk to some of his colleagues to get a balanced picture of who he is as a professional. He followed with an email containing names of fellow Tremper employees that he wanted us to interview.

RECOMMENDATION/CONCLUSION

Mr. Gallo admits to the examples provided by the students regarding his own biases, however he does not accept ownership of his inappropriate use of "mom jokes". Mr. Gallo appears to lack a level of maturity necessary to be a teacher, evidenced by his statement that he teaches a lot of and sometimes he starts acting like them and his behavior documented in the statements. As one student observed, it appears he wants to be more of a friend than a teacher.

The District's Code of Conduct is clear and strictly prohibits "any act of harassment, sexual, racial or other towards anyone; telling sexist or racial-type jokes, making racial or ethnic slurs." The District's mission is to provide excellent, challenging learning opportunities and experience that each student for success. Given the significant examples documented in the witness statements which establish a pattern of behavior and Mr. Gallo's lack of ownership of his behavior, HR recommends a 3-day unpaid disciplinary suspension, cultural sensitivity training to be completed by April 30, 2020, and assignment of a mentor for the ethnic studies coursework he is teaching for the 2019-2020 school year.

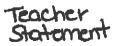
After informing the information I received, we decided to do a follow up with the two students the next day to see why they were reporting it now. That evening I received Mr. Gallo's statement.

In teaching the class, very, very difficult material must be covered. When examining prejudice or discrimination, I believe it is vital that we have real, deep down, honest discussions of what prejudice can be and where it comes from. This benefits students. As such, it is up to the teacher to put themselves out there to break the silence for this honest discussion.

Students may take words out of context, and I believe this is what has happened; missing the point and misinterpreting the tone and conclusions of our discussion. These accusations are exaggerated and now being presented two months after the daily lesson that's referenced. I question the motives. This accusation has also not been presented with other viewpoints from that day.

in discussing 'attractiveness' and 'relationships,' and 'prejudice,' I brought forth my difficulties with women who are more overweight. This, as I explained, is a prejudice.

In discussing prejudice toward African-Americans, i explained that in the goifing community, people still do a double-take on the golf course if black folks are present. This, as i explained, is a prejudice.

As for "mom jokes," the accusations again been exaggerated as 'quotad', though I admit making one or two, I am sorry. They are more about 'dating your mom' as 'my girlfriend' than the harsh sexual references as 'quotad'. Sexual references of that nature are entirely unprofessional and wrong. That I would not do.
