I saw and heard the following: On 07-21-2023 at approximately 1052 pm, I
Genesis T. Cruz was leaving from the area of Chick-Fila
on 75th St. I was driving my vehicle black Cadillac SRX
2013 E/B on 75th St. I was stopped with a red traffic
signal at the intersection of 75th St and Green bay Rd. I believed
that my traffic signal was about to change, I started to drive
my vehicle forward. It should be noted while I attempted
to make a left hand turn, I was not in the turning lane.
As I attempted to turn onto Green bay Rd from 75th St,
I noticed a burgandy colored sedan driving ^{W/B} at a high rate
of speed on 75th St. I attempted to turn on to Green bay
Rd and avoid contact with the sedan driving at a high
rate of speed. The ~~green~~ sedan struck my vehicle on
the passenger side causing it to flip. I can't recall
if my vehicle was struck from the front or the rear. I
did not give anyone consent to damage my vehicle and cause
me pain. I would like to pursue a complaint for the damage

Preface

On 07-20-23 at approximately 2257Hrs dispatch began to send officers to the area of Green Bay Rd and Hwy 50 (75St) for a rollover accident. Dispatch advised that two vehicles had collided at the intersection and one vehicle was resting on its roof. Additional information was provided that the two occupants in the overturned vehicle were a female and an infant. When officers arrived on scene, the occupants of the rolled-over vehicle had been extracted by bystanders and medical attention was being administered.

During the time officers were responding to the area and shortly after Officer Riser arrived on scene, information was relayed by radio that numerous subjects in the other involved vehicle had fled the scene on foot. Dispatch advised that occupants from a red Honda Civic included a black female and two black males. The CAD narrative and radio broadcast stated the occupants ran west. When Officer Riser arrived on scene, she broadcasted that four male black subjects were running towards Kohls and she later added information that a female black had a bun in her hair and was carrying a baby.

Officers began to canvass the area including an officer from the Pleasant Prairie Police Department who entered Applebee's at 2309hrs but didn't locate the suspects. At 2312hrs Applebee's staff called dispatch to report a suspicious couple seated inside the restaurant including a female black with a baby. Numerous officers entered the business including Officer Courtier and Officer Vences. Both officers engaged the couple in a conversation that led officers to attempt to detain both subjects. Officer Courtier and Officer Vences utilized force to arrest both parties. It was later determined neither subject was involved in the hit-and-run accident.

It is not clear what led to the conflicting and coincidental information of a female black suspect with a bun in her hair carrying a baby. A female suspect that fled from the vehicle accident was carrying Marc Garrett who is a young, short, and skinny male black who is paralyzed from the waist down. Witnesses at the vehicle accident may have only

seen the suspects running from behind leading them to believe one suspect was carrying a baby or small child when in fact they were carrying Marc Garrett.

Upon completing a review of this incident that included a review of all body-worn camera footage, all reports, body-worn camera footage from PPPD officers who responded to the scene, PPPD reports, and video footage from Applebee's internal surveillance system I am reporting and advising that policies of the Kenosha Police Department were violated.

Applebee's Management & Surveillance Footage

On 07-27-23 I emailed Sgt. Hancock and requested he begin the process of obtaining pieces of evidence for my investigation. On 08-01-23 Sgt. Hancock emailed me and stated that manager Jennifer Harris would be retrieving surveillance video for this investigation and the criminal investigation. On 08-12-23 I obtained information that Jennifer Harris had been fired from Applebee's.

On 08-14-23 at approximately 1115Hrs I entered Applebee's and was greeted by the new manager (unknown name). She stated that her Human Resources Manager Liza Keast was present inside the restaurant and asked if I wanted to speak to both of them together. We then spoke at a corner table on the east side of the restaurant. I explained that I needed the surveillance video footage from the evening of 07-20-23. Liza explained that they have video footage and she would speak to her legal team regarding the best way to turn over the footage. She requested I write down my information on a piece of paper and she would respond to me within a day. We also discussed the timeframe of the footage I was requesting. When I explained that I wanted to retrieve video from approximately 2130Hrs to midnight and I believed the hit-and-run accident occurred at 2300Hrs the new manager stated that she believed my timeframe was incorrect because she remembered capturing video footage of the accident near 2250hrs.

On 08-14-23 at 1614Hrs Liza sent me an email stating the following;

"Dear Lt. Jurgens,

I have requested the video you stopped I for today and I am not getting a response from legal at this time. My VP suggested a subpoena would be the best and fastest way for us to get it to you. Sorry if this is an inconvenience. My cell number is 414-238-7860 if you need to reach me immediately.

I will let you know as soon as we hear back from our legal team and I will forward quickly if a subpoena is not what they recommend is needed."

On 08-15-23 I responded to Liza via email asking for a direct contact to serve a subpoena.

On 08-18-23 at 1017Hrs I obtained a signed search warrant for the surveillance footage from Applebee's from the night of this incident. I then responded to Applebee's

and served the warrant with manager Jasmine. I explained to her that I would return on Monday at 1100hrs to obtain the video evidence or remove surveillance equipment from the restaurant. I explained that I didn't want to disrupt business hours or create any type of disturbance but needed the footage for the felony hit-and-run case we were investigating. Manager Jasmine agreed to notify the correct people within the company to provide me with the evidence.

On 08-18-23 at 1148hrs, I received a phone call and voicemail from Colin Pluta the Area Director for Applebee's. I returned his phone call at approximately 1230hrs from ext. 5240. During our conversation, he explained that on July 22nd or 23rd multiple officers and detectives attempted to retrieve the footage of this incident from the recording system inside the restaurant. He stated that these attempts failed and he believes the hard drive is corrupt. He stated to me that he currently has the hard drive being delivered to a data collection business that would attempt to retrieve the footage but stated it will likely not be done until Monday evening. I asked that he call when he has a solidified date and time the footage would be ready for pick up.

On 08-18-23 at approximately 1600hrs Colin called me again and stated that the company they utilized to retrieve the video footage stated the footage or hard drive was corrupt and data could not be retrieved. I then requested to take physical possession of the hard drive and receive a copy of the email he received from the data collection company. The email from the data collection company was authored by Jason Roskopf and addressed to Dianne Yaussy. I do not know either of these individuals and have had no communication with either person. Colin stated he would turn over the hard drive to me on Monday at approximately 1500hrs on 08-21-23. The following is the email Colin forwarded to me regarding the attempted data retrieval.

"Hi Dianne,

In reference to your data recovery request, I've worked on this all day and it doesn't appear that there's going to be a solution to recover any video from your ZOSI ZR16FK DVR's hard drive right now. The drive itself is not failed however every DVR stores its data differently and there's no standard filesystem or manner in which they write to the disk.

The only system I'm aware of for DVR recovery is from Magnet Forensics and is called DVR Examiner. Per the attached screenshot DVR Examiner doesn't recognize the filesystem (possibly due to encryption) and has no solution for it. I did upload a sample to them but would not hold out a lot of hope for a solution anytime soon. The last unrecognized one that we had I was told by Magnet Forensics' support team that it could take a year or more for them to solve it.

I'm expecting that they'll be reaching out to me on Monday regarding the sample that I sent to them however I would not expect to see a solution to it anytime soon. I can have this put back together for you then and ready for pickup by early Monday afternoon.

Also please note that this is the trial version that we use to determine whether it's going to be recoverable prior to buying a \$6,000 license for this product."

On 08-21-22 at approximately 1030hrs I retrieved the DVR system and hard drive from Applebee's. It was delivered to Forensic Officer Morton to be imaged. Officer Morton was able to retrieve data from two hard drives that were seized from the search warrant. All of the data from the hard drives were lacked any evidentiary value and did not provide any video footage from inside the restaurant during the time of this incident. As of the date this report was finalized the only footage the Kenosha Police Department was provided from Applebee's were short clips showing the suspects entering the restaurant, Shanya and Jermelle entering the restaurant, and officers searching the bathrooms inside the restaurant. The partial video clips were sent to me via my department email account.

It should be noted that the timestamps on the video footage from Applebee's are incorrect. The appropriate times were determined by synching body-worn camera footage of Officer Karaway clearing the women's bathroom with the internal surveillance footage from Applebee's. The Applebee's footage showed Officer Karaway knocking on the female bathroom door at 2259hrs and Officer Karaway's body-worn camera footage shows a timestamp of 2320hrs. For the remainder of this report, I will reference adjusted times of 21 minutes past the timestamps indicated on Applebee's surveillance footage.

At approximately 2205hrs Jermelle and Shanya entered through the front entrance of the restaurant. Shanya was carrying a purse and another bag that was likely a diaper bag. Jermelle was carrying their child. They waited at the host stand, were greeted, and were escorted to the upper section on the south side of the restaurant. This footage was observed through channel 4 of the Applebee's surveillance footage system.

At 2301hrs two individuals, whom I believe were employees of Applebee's, were observed standing and talking at a point-of-sale system near the to-go entrance on the north east side of the restaurant. They were facing each other standing facing east and west. At 2340:10 the suspects from the hit-and-run accident began to enter through the to-go entrance of the restaurant. Five subjects entered through this door, and all entered into the men's bathroom in a single file line. I believe that the subject carrying Marc Garrett was Janiah D. Washington. Janiah was the only female in this group.

Officer Riser

On the day of this incident Officer Riser was assigned to third shift patrol (2230 – 0630hrs). Due to short staffing on second shift she responded to a request for officers to work overtime on patrol. Officer Riser began her shift at approximately 1830Hrs and worked until approximately 0700Hrs on 07-21-23.

On 07-20-23 at approximately 2257Hrs Officer Riser was dispatched to a rollover accident at 75St and Green Bay Rd. Officer Riser was the first officer to arrive on scene. She parked just north of the two vehicles involved in the accident and approached a group seated and standing on the concrete median near the center turn lane for southbound traffic. This interaction was not recorded on her body-worn camera because it was not activated. [REDACTED]

After a brief interaction with a witness on scene who pointed in a northwest direction, Officer Riser stated over the air “I have four African American males running towards Kohls.” Officer Riser then began to coordinate the response of other officers to assist with traffic control while she was out of view of her dash camera. Officer Riser returned to view and then walked off with the original witness who approached her. While off camera, Officer Riser provided additional suspect information including the registration of the other involved vehicle and a description of one of the suspects as a female with a scarf, a bun in her hair, with a baby in her possession. At approximately 2304:30hrs, Officer Riser returned to her patrol car and put on her reflective traffic vest. As she exited her patrol vehicle and started to put on her vest, Officer Riser activated her BWC. The remainder of her interactions on scene were recorded with her body-worn camera.

At approximately 2308:22hrs, Officer Nano #785 asked over the radio if there was a clothing description for the suspects. Dispatch advised that they had no clothing description. Officer Thorpe then stated over the air that the only description was a female with a bun in her hair, wearing a scarf. At approximately 2309:01hrs, Officer Riser stated over the radio, “I have a female wearing red, a witness says.” Dispatch then entered this information into the call notes. This information was provided by two people seated in a minivan that stated they arrived shortly after the accident. These two subjects were not identified on scene. Officer Riser then continued her accident investigation including searching the suspect vehicle, determining the at-fault driver, writing citations, and relaying information to dispatch and officers on scene at Applebee’s. Officer Riser eventually responded to Applebee’s and established probable cause to arrest one subject in the bathroom after the registered owner of the red Honda provided evidence of the suspect driving.

Upon completing my review of Officer Risers' reports, body-worn camera footage, [REDACTED], I believe she acted appropriately throughout this call for service. Officer Riser arrived on scene and believed her body-worn camera was activated because she had synced her camera at the start of her shift. I believe it is reasonable for her to believe her camera was on when she exited her patrol vehicle upon arriving on scene. I found no evidence or conflicting evidence to believe she would have purposely kept her camera off during her initial contacts. Also, while reviewing her body-worn camera, when Officer Riser did activate her body worn camera, I believe it was an appropriate action for the purposes of gathering as much information from witnesses as possible to broadcast descriptive suspect information over the radio for responding officers. Assessing how this case progressed, it would have been beneficial for officers to identify all witnesses on scene, but it was reasonable while on scene for Officer Riser to ensure that Olivia Steele provided a statement due to her proximity to the crash and Steele's complete account of what occurred before, during, and after the accident.

I find that Officer Riser acted within the mission, vision, and core values of the Kenosha Police Department and the policies and procedures of the department.

PPPD – Sgt. Lodygowski

Sgt. Lodygowski of the Pleasant Prairie Police Department was the only PPPD officer to complete a police report for this case. He is the supervisor who blocked Jermelle English's movement through the restaurant after Officer Courtier informed English that he was being detained and not free to leave. Sgt. Lodygowski also assisted Officer Vences in detaining and arresting Jermelle. His body-worn camera footage documented the events leading up to the use of force including Officer Vences' actions.

In his report, Sgt. Lodygowski wrote that the first time he entered the restaurant was when Kenosha P.D. officers arrived after Applebee's called to report a suspicious couple. Sgt. Lodygowski documented the behavior of Jermelle and Shanya in his report and why he intervened and stopped Jermelle from moving throughout the restaurant. He also documented the resistive behavior of Jermelle and his fear that Jermelle was injuring his child due to his resistive behavior.

PPPD – Officer Quilling

Officer Quilling did not complete a report and no body-worn camera footage was provided to me documenting the first time he entered Applebee's and observed Jermelle and Shanya seated at their booth.

Officer Courtier then arrived on scene and relayed information to dispatch regarding his arrival (2312:05hrs). Dispatch then stated the following,

“10-04, they actually just advised it was a male, a female and a baby there [Applebee’s].”

Once inside the restaurant, Officer Courtier approached Shanya Boyd and Jermelle English. Jermelle was holding onto Taquaris Taylor, their one-year-old child. The two booths to the east of Jermelle and Shanya appeared to have dishes and glasses on them. Jermelle was seated with his legs outside of the booth facing north with Taquaris in his arms and on his lap. On the table Jermelle and Shanya were seated at had drink glasses in center to outside edge of the table and menus. No food or plates appeared to be on the table.

Officer Courtier started the interaction by stating, “Yeah, were you just in an accident?” Jermelle responded “No, we been here the whole time, what’s going on?” Officer Courtier did not respond to Jermelle’s question and asked how long the couple had been present at the restaurant. Jermelle responded that they had been at the restaurant for an hour and forty-five minutes. Officer Courtier paused then said, “Yeah, okay.” He then walked away and called out to the restaurant staff, “How long have they been here?” An employee said, “Twenty minutes, half an hour.” While this was occurring, PPPD Sgt. Lodygowski and Officer Quilling arrived on scene. I am unable to definitively determine when the hit-and-run accident occurred but due to the rapid SOS call being received from dispatch at 2256:34hrs it is reasonable to believe this is near the time the impact occurred between the two vehicles. Officer Courtier arrived on scene 16 minutes and 22 seconds after the rapid SOS call was received. Jermelle and Shanya had been in the restaurant for approximately one hour and seven minutes as Officer Courtier entered Applebee’s. Jermelle and Applebee’s management both under and over estimated the time Jermelle and Shanya had been inside the restaurant creating a one hour and fifteen-minute discrepancy in the times each reported for how long Jermelle and Shanya had been in the restaurant. Also, dispatch provided information that the male, female and baby Applebee’s called emergency service about had “Just walked in...”

PPPD Officer Quilling stated that when he arrived earlier, he noticed the couple Officer Courtier was speaking to. Officer Quilling stated, “Yeah, they were here when I came here.” Officer Karaway then sought clarification asking, “They were already here?” PPPD Officer Quilling again stated, “Yeah, they had drinks on the table.” Officers Roepke and Karaway then walked away to go look for the suspects in a different part of the restaurant. Officers Karaway and Roepke located all involved parties in the men’s bathroom.

Officer Courtier and Officer Vences then began to communicate and stated to each other that when PPPD Officers first arrived on scene they were delayed and they believed it was possible Jermelle and Shanya had fled the scene and sat down, ordered drinks and food before PPPD arrived at the restaurant. Officer Courtier and Vences then began to ask what car the couple arrived in. While this was occurring PPPD Officer Quilling

approached the bartender and spoke to him over the bar. PPPD Officer Quilling then approached Officer Courtier and stated, "When I came in here that empty glass was there and she already drank it, I don't think they are involved so I am going to go." Officer Courtier did not react to this information and did nothing to investigate the matter beyond questioning Jermelle and Shanya.

Jermelle asked again for an explanation. Officer Courtier told them that a hit-and-run accident occurred and someone saw Jermelle and Shanya enter the restaurant with their child. Officer Vences began to describe the clothing and physical features of the suspect from witness accounts and Officer Courtier said, "So that is why if you could just tell us what car you came in we could be done." Jermelle then told the officers, "Yeah, that's over with," and to go find the involved parties and expresses that someone else was wearing red as he pointed to the opposite end of the restaurant. Jermelle also told the officers to check the cameras and again pointed to the opposite end of the restaurant.

It should be noted that later in the investigation it was determined that Shanya and Jermelle arrive in a 2012 white Ford Fiesta bearing Illinois registration of EA29311. During the interaction Officer Courtier and Vences had with Jermelle and Shanya this vehicle can be seen in body-worn camera footage. It was parked in the Applebee's parking lot on the south side and in view to the left of Jermelle. Jermelle and Shanya were asked numerous times to show officers the vehicle they arrived in and they refused to provide this information. Also, Shanya and Jermelle were seated on the south side of the restaurant. In his conversation with Officer Courtier and Vences Jermelle pointed to the north end of the establishment, he was pointing in the direction of the bathrooms. All five suspects of the hit-and-run were located and ultimately one was arrested from this bathroom.

Jermelle then stood up and began to walk away stating he needed to take his son to the bathroom. As Jermelle began to walk east he was approaching the entrance/exit to the restaurant. Jermelle was then stopped by PPPD Sgt. Lodygowski as Officer Courtier told the couple they were not free to leave, and they were being detained. Officer Courtier continued to ask what car the couple came in; Jermelle and Shanya refused to provide officers with this information. Jermelle then walked past Officer Courtier and Vences. Shanya attempted to follow Jermelle but was stopped by Officer Vences who inhibited her movement by standing in front of her. Officer Vences then told Shanya she needed to stay with his partner (Officer Courtier). Shanya then verbally stated she would not stay with Officer Courtier. Officer Courtier then attempted to place Shanya in handcuffs; a physical struggle then ensued. See Sgt. Hancock's documentation regarding the defense and arrest tactics utilized to affect the arrest of Shanya.

Upon securing Shanya in handcuffs and affecting an arrest on her, only Officer Roepke ask her if she was okay. Officer Courtier never asked Shanya if she needed medical attention nor did he attempt to decontaminate her from the OC spray he administered. For the next 30-plus minutes, Shanya was either inside Applebee's or in the rear of Officer Courtier's patrol vehicle with OC spray on her face. At approximately 2323hrs, Officer Courtier exited his patrol vehicle and entered Applebee's to inform

officers he was leaving the scene. Shanya was left unattended in the rear of his patrol vehicle until 2325hrs.

During the transport of Shanya to the Kenosha County Jail, there were multiple interactions Shanya when Officer Courtier engaged in badgering-type conversations. Shanya began to argue with Officer Courtier expressing that she believed he had no right to arrest her. Shanya stated, "Y'all full of shit." Officer Courtier immediately responded, "You're full of shit." Shanya then stated, "You mad because I whooped that ass." Officer Courtier responded, "Yeah, you're cool." He later stated, "That's why you are going to jail... Yeah well, C.P.S. [Child Protective Services] is taking your kid. They are. We are calling them right now, my partners are calling them." Officer Courtier then stated to dispatch, "Let the jail know she is combative." At 2336hrs, while inside the jail, Officer Courtier expressed to other officers what had occurred inside the restaurant. Shanya interjected stating, "[The fight was] for no reason." Officer Courtier responded, "Yeah, for no reason, because you wouldn't shut your mouth."

It should be noted that I did not locate any documentation or verbal communication from any officer on scene suggesting or attempting to place Shanya's child in protective custody through a call to C.P.S. Also, while reviewing the camera recording the back seat of Officer Courtier's patrol vehicle during the transport of Shanya to the jail I did not observe her to be combative, she only engaged in verbal communication with Officer Courtier. She also didn't express that she would be combative or a physical problem once released from the patrol vehicle.

Officer Courtier charged Shanya with resisting arrest, obstructing, and possession of marijuana. In his report, he wrote the following:

"I ordered Shanya to stay back and she told me no. Shanya was in close proximity to PO Vences and she was continuing to escalate her behavior. I then placed my hands on Shanya's right arm to prevent her from walking with the male and behind PO Vences. Shanya pulled her arm away from me at which time I told her she was now under arrest and directed her into the side of a booth as she was defying my direct lawful order."

Reviewing Officer Courtier's BWC, it showed the moment Jermelle walked past Officer Courtier and Officer Vences. Officer Vences inhibited Shanya's movement by blocking her ability to continue to walk through the dining room. Officer Vences then stated to Shanya that she needed to stay with his partner (Courtier). Shanya stated she will not and then Officer Courtier grasped her hand and ordered her numerous times to place her hands behind her back while struggling with her. This contradicts his report that stated that he provided her a lawful order to "stay back." Additionally, Officer Courtier never stated to Shanya that she was under arrest. Officer Courtier's documentation differed from his body-worn camera footage but his actions and the actions on scene by other officers created a situation that Shanya should have reasonably believed she wasn't free to leave and was under arrest.

Interview Officer Courtier

On August 18, 2023 at approximately 1403hrs to 1530hrs I, Lt. Jurgens #553, and Sgt. Hancock interviewed Officer Courtier. The interview was conducted in room 1141 of the Public Safety Building and was recorded. Officer Courtier elected to have Kenosha Professional Police Association Representatives Tetrick and Sheskey present during the interview. Officer Courtier was read his Garrity warning which he signed and that form is been included with this report.

I began the interview by asking Officer Courtier why he was in the Kenosha County Jail's Sally Port before responding to this incident. He stated he did not recall. He expressed that when he heard the call come over the radio he believed the roll-over accident was likely serious and due to a shift change, he did not believe the west end of the city was adequately staffed so he elected to respond to the call location. Officer Courtier admitted to driving to the area of Applebee's with his lights and sirens activated from approximately 10ave and 55st to Hwy 50 and Green Bay Rd. I asked Officer Courtier about the phone call he participated in while driving in emergency mode and he expressed that he believed that he received the call and did not place the call. Officer Courtier was shown his patrol vehicle video of nearly striking a utility pole on 63St; he stated he couldn't recall what transpired to cause this maneuver but believed he was looking at his MDC.

Officer Courtier was then asked why he did not stop at the accident scene. Reviewing Officer Riser's dash camera footage, radio traffic, and Officer Courtier's dash camera footage, it was not clear if the intersection was fully blocked upon Officer Courtier's arrival. Officer Courtier explained that he did not stop on scene because he believed the intersection was fully blocked or was going to be shortly. He then went into an explanation of checking the area for the suspects then arriving on scene at Applebee's. Officer Courtier stated that he observed that Jermelle and Shanya matched the description given by Officer Riser which included a male and female black with a baby. Shanya also had a bun in her hair which Officer Courtier stated matched the description Officer Riser provided over the radio.

Upon Officer Courtier completing an overview of the entire incident, I began to question him about the initial greeting of Jermelle and Shanya. I played Officer Courtier's body-worn camera footage up to the point of Officer Courtier questioning staff from across the restaurant as to how long Jermelle and Shanya had been present inside Applebee's. I asked Officer Courtier if he believed that his verbal communication was the most professional way to handle the situation to which he responded that he understood what I "was getting at." Officer Courtier went on to state that he was not trying to be unprofessional but was instead being direct with his questioning. Officer Courtier was asked if he believed that when he yelled across the restaurant inquiring how long Jermelle and Shanya had been present inside the restaurant if it could have been perceived by the couple as a form of stating that they were lying. Officer Courtier acknowledged that it could be by stating, "I could see that."

Officer Courtier was then questioned about his recollection of statements made by any Pleasant Prairie Officer regarding their interaction with Jermelle and Shanya before Officers Courtier and Vences arrived on scene.

Officer Courtier admitted that he heard Officer Quilling state that he did not “think” Jermelle and Shanya were involved and an explanation regarding drinks being on the table they sat at. Officer Courtier explained that he did not act on this information because Officer Quilling stated that he did not “think” they were involved but he did not know for sure. Officer Courtier also stated that he knew there had to be a delay from when Officer Quilling arrived on scene in relation to when the accident occurred.

Officer Courtier was then shown body-worn camera footage that showed how Officer Quilling told officers three times that Jermelle and Shanya were not believed to be involved because they were present when he initially arrived on scene. I then explained the timeline of events which included a rapid SOS call, officers being dispatched, and Officer Quilling arriving eleven minutes after the rapid SOS call. I asked Officer Courtier if Jermelle and Shanya showed signs of individuals being involved in that type of incident in that timeframe. Officer Courtier stated that due to the delay, he believed it was reasonable that Jermelle and Shanya would not be out of breath or appearing as though they had run from a hit-and-run accident.

Officer Courtier was then asked if he believed that he should have attempted to slow down the investigation and possibly review surveillance footage or speak to officers one-on-one away from the suspects. Officer Courtier acknowledged that investigative approach would have helped but that he did not have time to engage in that process because Jermelle stood up and walked away. Officer Courtier was then asked when Officer Quilling stated for the third time that he did not believe Jermelle and Shanya were involved, should he have tried a different means of eliminating the couple from suspicion. Officer Courtier acknowledged that because he now knew due to watching his BWC footage that Quilling told officers three times Shanya and Jermelle were not involved, he should have spoken to Officer Quilling directly but did not know that information on scene.

Officer Courtier was then shown his body-worn camera footage as questioning escalated between officers and Jermelle and Shanya. Jermelle then stood up and walked away from officers. In response to the footage, Officer Courtier interjected stating that his objective was to have Jermelle and Shanya tell him what car they came in hoping to immediately remove them from the pool of suspects. Officer Courtier was then directed to refer back to his report. He was shown that, in his report, he documented that he told Shanya to stay back, but body-worn camera footage showed that did not occur. Officer Courtier acknowledged that he believed he mistook Officer Vences’ words for his own and that he never told Shanya to stay back. Officer Courtier was then shown in his report, specifically the sentence that Officer Courtier wrote that Shanya was told she was under arrest. Body-worn camera footage was then played showing that Officer Courtier never told Shanya she was under arrest. Officer Courtier acknowledged that he never told Shanya she was under arrest but instead told her to put her hands behind her back.

Sgt. Hancock then took over the interview and asked questions of Officer Courtier specifically related to his use of force. See Officer Hancock's report for further info.

Officer Courtier was then shown body-worn camera footage from the time Shanya was secured into handcuffs until she was placed into the rear of his patrol vehicle. Officer Courtier was asked if anyone asked Shanya if she needed medical attention. Officer Courtier first referred to when Officer Roepke asked Shanya if she was "okay," to which she responded that she was not and she was confused. Officer Courtier was asked again if anyone had asked Shanya if she needed medical attention and he stated, "Directly, no." Officer Courtier was questioned if he recalled, at any point throughout his entire interaction with Shanya, if he asked her if she needed medical attention; Officer Courtier responded that he was not aware of ever asking her if she needed medical care. Officer Courtier was asked if he was aware of the Kenosha Police Department's Use of Force Policy regarding medical care. Officer Courtier answered that officers are required to provide medical care for subjects who ask for medical attention or in situations in which care is necessary. Officer Courtier was asked about what the use of force policy requires for aftercare when OC spray is utilized. Officer Courtier acknowledged that an attempt to decontaminate the subject is required. Officer Courtier further stated, "I didn't have anything to decontaminate her with, no." Officer Courtier was then asked if subjects who are in custody need to be monitored when in the rear of a patrol vehicle to which he acknowledged that they do. Officer Courtier then acknowledged that he walked into Applebee's and left Shanya alone in his patrol vehicle leaving her unobserved. He also admitted to failing to utilize his radio to communicate with other officers that he needed to transport Shanya to the Kenosha County Jail as opposed to walking into the restaurant to inform officers of this transport.

Officer Courtier was then questioned regarding his plan to decontaminate Shanya after driving her to jail. He stated that every time he has OC sprayed someone, he has decontaminated them utilizing the eye washing station in the bathroom in the Sally Port of the Kenosha County Jail. Officer Courtier was then shown his body-worn camera footage of his transport of Shanya from Applebee's to jail. During the trip, Officer Courtier asks dispatch to call correctional staff and alert them that Shanya was combative. Officer Courtier was questioned as to why he did so and asked if Shanya was combative at the moment he put the request in with dispatch. Officer Courtier stated that Shanya was not combative at the time of the request but was during moments prior. Officer Courtier was then asked if every time he utilizes force to effect an arrest does he alert jail staff that an in-custody inmate is combative. Officer Courtier stated, "If they are still like amped up and if there is a good chance they are still going to continue when they get out of the car, yeah." Officer Courtier was then asked if he felt it was reasonable to declare that Shanya was combative and he stated it was because he has done the same thing several times in the past.

Officer Courtier was once again questioned regarding why he did not attempt to decontaminate Shanya. Officer Courtier stated that he believed it was not reasonable to attempt to remove Shanya from the patrol vehicle because every time he spoke to her she would become agitated, because he did not administer a large amount of OC spray, and because Shanya was not complaining that her face hurt or that she could not breathe.

Officer Courtier stated that for these reasons, he did not feel it was urgent or necessary to decontaminate Shanya and wash her face of OC spray. Officer Courtier was asked if he believed he could have utilized Officers Boeck and Colon as aides to remove Shanya and decontaminate her. It should be noted that Officers Boeck and Colon responded to the Kenosha County Jail Sally Port in response to Officer Courtier's radio traffic that he had a combative person in custody and in transport to the jail. Officer Courtier acknowledged that he could have utilized his backup but he was not willing to risk another physical confrontation if she was removed from his patrol vehicle.

Officer Courtier was then asked how correctional officers handle the removal of uncooperative inmates from the rear of patrol vehicles. Officer Courtier explained that jail staff often request a vehicle window be rolled down slightly and correctional officers will speak with the inmate. Officer Courtier was asked if Officer Boeck or Colon could have been requested to attempt this type of dialog. Officer Courtier acknowledged that it could have been attempted, but suspects often know the difference between police officers and correctional officers and our (police) presence could have irritated Shanya. Officer Courtier further explained how sometimes during the booking process officers are requested to move out of sight because their presence intensifies situations. Officer Courtier was then asked if he believed Shanya was at that level of uncooperativeness as she sat silent for 11 minutes in his patrol vehicle. Officer Courtier stated, "How she was at Applebee's yes, and she could have easily, right now, no. Officer Courtier was asked if, at any point, did he consider removing Shanya from the rear of his patrol vehicle to decontaminate her. He stated, no because he did not want to reinitiate an incident. It was then explained to Officer Courtier that for over 31 minutes Shanya was not provided medical treatment and was left with pepper spray on her face including more than 11 minutes in the rear of Officer Courtier's patrol vehicle while he waited for two Kenosha Police Officers and seven Kenosha County Correctional Officers to remove Shanya from his patrol vehicle and into a holding cell. During this time in the interview, Officer Courtier was resting his elbow on the desk with his head resting against a closed fist while he shook his head several times while muttering an affirmation. Officer Courtier was asked if the reason he did not decontaminate Shanya was for punishment and he responded, "We don't punish people."

Officer Courtier's Kenosha Professional Police Association representatives asked to take a short recess which was granted. Upon their return, Officer Courtier wanted to add information to his statement. He explained that during the initial interaction with Jermelle, he showed signs of a person who was trying to evade arrest or police questioning; he was looking for the exits and talked over officers. Also, Officer Courtier added that the time discrepancy provided by Applebee's staff of when Shanya and Jermelle arrived at the restaurant was too long to overlook and was suspicious in itself.

Officer Courtier spoke about the discrepancies in his report, more specifically the sentences that indicate that he told Shanya to stay back and that she was under arrest both of which did not occur. Officer Courtier explained that he writes his reports from memory and does not narrate a report from his body-worn camera footage. Because he did not watch his camera footage, these errors occurred. Officer Courtier also stated that he has observed a wide array of responses to OC spray and Shanya did not show signs that the OC spray was affecting her in a manner that led him to believe Shanya needed to

be medically cared for or decontaminated immediately. It was expressed to Officer Courtier that this is an open investigation, and he is not to talk about any aspects of the call for service, investigation, or interview. The interview concluded at 1530hrs.

Through my review, I believe that Officer Courtier's behavior, report writing, and investigative techniques violated numerous Kenosha Police Department policies. These policies include:

1.1 Mission, Vision, and Core Values of the Kenosha Police Department

The mission of the Kenosha Police Department is: "To Strengthen and Serve our Community by Putting People First."

Officer Courtier failed to follow the mission of the Kenosha Police Department through his actions, demeanor, and investigative techniques he utilized on this call.

1.3 Use of Force: Medical Assistance Requirement

All department personnel who engage in the use of deadly or non-deadly force within the scope of their employment shall:

- A. Check the subject for injuries and administer first aid to their level of training, if required, first aid shall include, but is not limited to, treatment for Oleoresin Capsicum exposures and the use of an Electronic Control Device.*
- B. Summon an ambulance, paramedics, rescue unit, or appropriate medical aid, if necessary.*
- C. Maintain close personal observation and keep in close physical contact with the subject while continuing to administer first aid while the subject is in your custody.*
- D. All officers are to monitor all subjects involved in the use of force contacts for positional asphyxia whenever physical restraint is applied to the subject.*

Upon using force against Shanya, Officer Courtier failed to follow aftercare protocols. He did not administer medical aid, did not ask if Shanya needed medical attention, and failed to maintain close proximity to her while she was in the back of his patrol vehicle.

I spoke to Sgt. Campbell of the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department and asked him if the eye washing station in the bathroom of the Sally Port was functional during the time of this incident. Sgt. Campbell stated he believed it was and did not recall that eye washing station being out of service anytime recently. On August 14, 2023 at approximately 1545Hrs I visited the Kenosha County Jail's Sally Port, specifically the decontamination room/bathroom that is accessible from inside the Sally Port. The door to that room was unlocked and has, to the best of my knowledge, always been unlocked during my entire career as a Kenosha Police Officer. Inside the room is a shower, a toilet,

a sink, and an eye washing station. I tested the eye washing station and confirmed it was working properly.

For approximately eleven minutes, Officer Courtier was inside the Kenosha County Sally Port with other members of third shift patrol. During that time, He failed to remove Shanya from his patrol vehicle and failed to decontaminate her. During the entire time Shanya was inside the jail's Sally Port and in the back of Officer Courtier's patrol vehicle, she never raised her voice, was not argumentative or combative, and did not attempt to destroy the interior of the patrol car.

17.6 Safe Operation of Departmental Vehicles.

"It is the policy of this Department to require Department employees to operate Departmental vehicles and privately owned vehicles used for Departmental business in a safe, responsible, intelligent, and lawful manner at all times."

Officer Courtier engaged in a phone call while driving in emergency mode southbound on Sheridan Rd. This phone call was not necessary and added additional risk to this style of driving. Also, something distracted Officer Courtier causing him to almost strike a utility pole on 63st, he stated it was due to looking at his mobile data computer.

26.1 General Rules and Regulations – II: All Sworn and Civilian Member of the Department, While on Duty, at All Times Shall:

"Be courteous and respectful to other members of the department and to the general public."

&

"Be competent, efficient, and exercise common sense in the performance of their duties."

Officer Courtier's behavior, verbal communication, and attitude toward Shanya and Jermelle was inappropriate and he failed to calm self, calm subject, reassure the subject, and rebuild the subject's self-esteem. Additionally, he continued to argue and berate Shanya while transporting her to the Kenosha County Jail. This included engaging with her in argumentative conversation and stating that it was the intention of the Kenosha Police Department to place her child in protective custody.

41.10 Police Reports - Completion, Submission, Approval and Distribution.

"It is the policy of the Kenosha Police Department to document reported and suspected crimes and criminal activity occurring within its jurisdiction. Additionally, certain non-criminal events, situations, and circumstances will also be documented. Employees will conduct a thorough, comprehensive, and complete preliminary investigation. Employees will complete any and all additional paperwork required."

In Officer Courtier's interview, he acknowledged that he incorrectly wrote in his report that he told Shanya to stay back and that she was under arrest. He explained that this occurred because he wrote his report from his memory without reviewing his body-

worn camera footage and not that he intentionally lied in his report. I believe that Officer Courtier should not be disciplined for lying in his report because I do not believe that was his intention and lying in the context of his report would not serve a reasonable purpose. It is reasonable to believe that he mistook what Officer Vences said for his own verbal communication. However, the Kenosha Police Department policy for body-worn cameras allows officers to review their video footage and Officer Courtier could and should have reviewed his footage before writing his report. It is also reasonable for a person to believe that if an officer in full uniform has placed one handcuff on their wrist while being told to put their hands behind their back they are under arrest. Officer Courtier used this reasonableness to explain why he mistyped in his report. Though this explanation is reasonable, it does not negate the fact that Officer Courtier's report was inaccurate and was not completed thoroughly and competently.

Officer Courtier failed to act within the mission, vision, and core values of the Kenosha Police Department. His response and actions during and post-care from this call for service are not an example of putting people first, providing a high level of service to our community, and failed to follow our core values by not showing respect or excellence in our daily work. I am recommending the steps of progressive discipline be followed for Officer Courtier.

Officer Vences

On the day of this incident Officer Vences was assigned to second shift patrol (2230 – 0630hrs). Officer Vences began his shift at approximately 2230hrs and worked until approximately 0300hrs on 07-21-23.

Officer Vences self-dispatched to this call at 2303hrs and began to check the area for the suspects. There is no squad video recording him responding to this call for service or checking the area. Once the information of Applebee's calling to report a suspicious couple inside the restaurant was dispatched, Officer Vences arrived on scene at approximately 2312hrs. Officer Vences walked into the restaurant directly behind Officer Courtier.

Once Officer Courtier began his line of questioning with Jermelle and Shanya, Officer Vences assisted in questioning when Officer Courtier walked away to question Applebee's staff. Officer Vences asked Jermelle, "What did you guys drive in?" Jermelle turned his back and said something inaudible while Officer Vences said, "We want to clear you from this." Jermelle then appeared agitated and ignored the questioning from Officer Vences and Courtier regarding the car they drove in. Due to the music in the restaurant and Officer Vences' portable radio, I am unable to determine what Jermelle stated but I believe he was upset at the way he was approached by Officer Courtier and the lack of information he was provided regarding the initial questioning that occurred.

It should be noted that later in the investigation it was determined that Shanya and Jermelle arrive in a 2012 white Ford Fiesta bearing Illinois registration of EA29311. During the interaction Officer Courtier and Vences had with Jermelle and Shanya this vehicle can be seen in body-worn camera footage. It was parked in the Applebee's

parking lot on the south side and in view to the left of Jermelle. Jermelle and Shanya were asked numerous times to show officers the vehicle they arrived in and they refused to provide this information.

Officer Vences stated to Officer Courtier that the Pleasant Prairie Police Department's arrival was delayed which could have made it possible for Jermelle and Shanya to have fled the accident, enter Applebee's, and order food and drinks all prior to PPPD Officer Quilling arriving on scene and observe the couple seated in their booth. Officer Quilling can then be observed addressing Officer Courtier directly, stating that he does not believe the couple was involved, and then exiting the restaurant. Officer Quilling's comments can be heard on Officer Vences' body camera audio.

Jermelle then asked the officers to explain what is going on. When Officer Courtier stated that witnesses observed Jermelle and Shanya run into the restaurant with the baby, Jermelle began to appear agitated and expressed to officers that someone else involved in the accident was wearing red and officers should attempt to locate this party and check video footage. Jermelle was asked several times to express what car he arrived in but he refused to provide this information.

Jermelle then stood up and was stopped by Sgt. Lodygowski of the PPPD. Jermelle then turned around and proceeded west then north through the restaurant. Officer Vences ordered Shanya to stay with Officer Courtier and he proceeded to close the gap to Jermelle. Once in close proximity, Officer Vences grasped Jermelle's arm and told him to stop before his camera shut off. In his report Officer Vences wrote the following;

"The male half attempted to walk around the outer perimeter of the restaurant in a clockwise fashion (while still holding the child), so I told the female half to stay with Officer Courtier (in an attempt to separate the two parties). Considering the rollover accident that occurred, no cooperation from both adults, the male half's unpredictable behavior attempting to walk away from us, and the child's welfare (possible trauma/injuries), I attempted to stop the male half with a modified escort hold to his right arm. The male, while still holding the small child, attempted to swiftly pull away from my grip, so I told him to stop and a struggle ensued; at that time, I was concerned for the baby's safety and did not want the child to fall or get hurt from the male half's decisions possibly forcing us to escalate.

Pleasant Prairie Police assisted me during the struggle, and we were able to get the male half down to a seated position and retrieve the baby from his grasp; during the struggle, the male half continued to attempt to pull away and while doing so, was squeezing the child tighter in his arm(s). Reference Pleasant Prairie Police Case # 2023-11644 for their information. After the baby was safely retrieved, I performed a modified "secure the head" decentralization from a half-kneeling stance. The male was successfully decentralized to the ground, and was given several commands to put his hands behind his back. To gain compliance, I delivered multiple strong side hand strikes and strong side forearm strikes to the male half. Due to the dynamics of the situation, the

strikes met the subject's head, but they successfully caused him to relax his arms and put those near his back. The subject was arrested for Obstructing/Resisting and placed in the recovery position.”

Officer Vences' body camera turned back on for 29 seconds showing him holding one arm and Jermelle's hair. Jermelle was yelling for him to let go of him while officers ordered Jermelle to let go of his child. PPPD Sgt. Lodygowski attempted to remove the child from Jermelle's grip. He wrote in his report the following;

“At one point, Officer M. Vences attempted to gain control of Jermelle's right arm, as I attempted to gain control of his left arm. While grabbing onto Jermelle's arm, I felt very strong resistive tension from both his arm and upper body, as he continued to pull away from us.”

The child was eventually removed from Jermelle's grip and handed over to someone inside the restaurant. The use of force from Officer Vences was not captured on his body camera. When his camera is turned back on, Jermelle was seated in a chair inside the restaurant and was speaking with the Kenosha Fire Department for medical treatment.

See Sgt. Hancock's documentation regarding the defense and arrest tactics utilized to affect the arrest of Jermelle.

Once Jermelle was taken into custody, Officer Vences and Sgt. Lodygowski provided him with aftercare. Officers asked for a medical response, moved Jermelle to a seated position, and continued to monitor his well-being. Officer Vences stayed with Jermelle until he was escorted outside and onto a gurney to be transported to an area hospital. Officer Karaway then handcuffed Jermelle to the gurney. Officer Price rode in the ambulance with Jermelle to St. Catherine's Hospital. Officer Price was eventually relieved by Officer Maykut who transported Jermelle to the Kenosha County Jail.

It should be noted that retrieval of Officer Vences' body-worn camera footage was successful and the Kenosha Police Department has the uninterrupted footage from this incident. Sgt. Hancock documented in his report why audio turns off and on during this video clip. Additionally, I have found no evidence that Officer Vences purposely shut off his body-worn camera. I believe it is highly plausible that during the struggle with Jermelle the camera's record button was inadvertently pressed.

Interview Officer Vences

On 08-24-23 at approximately 1451hrs to 1604hrs I, Lt. Jurgens, and Sgt. Hancock interviewed Officer Vences. This interview was completed in room 1141 of the Public Safety Building and was recorded. Officer Vences elected to have Kenosha Professional Police Representatives Tetrick and Deates present during the interview. He was read his Garrity warning which he signed and that form has been included with this report.

Officer Vences was asked how he became involved in this incident. He explained that he was at Culver's (5220 Green Bay Rd) and because of his location on the west end of the city he felt it was appropriate to respond to the area of the hit-and-run accident. When asked why he responded to Applebee's Officer Vences explained that an employee called dispatch reporting that a couple inside the restaurant possibly matched the description of the suspects and was acting suspiciously. Officer Vences was asked to elaborate further about the suspect information that was broadcasted over the radio. He stated that he believed that Officer Riser had stated that the suspects included multiple black males and a female black subject with a bun in her hair, one of the subjects was wearing red and someone was carrying a baby.

Officer Vences was then asked if he recalled what dispatch had broadcasted over the radio regarding what information they had received from the call from Applebee's staff. Officer Vences stated he couldn't recall the exact language but it was regarding subjects inside the restaurant matching the description of the suspects who fled from the accident. Officer Vences was then asked what he was looking for when he entered the restaurant. Officer Vences stated he was looking for someone who matched the description originally provided by Officer Riser.

Officer Vences was asked to describe who he entered the restaurant with and what he did upon entering Applebee's. He stated that he arrived with several other officers and was immediately directed to speak with Jermelle and Shanya (the parties Applebee's called about). Officer Vences was asked to describe his interaction with Jermelle and Shanya when he arrived. Officer Vences stated that initially, he asked the couple basic questions to gather information and officers provided an explanation as to why they were present and speaking to Jermelle and Shanya. Officer Vences also stated that he observed that Shanya had a bun in her hair, Jermelle was wearing red, possibly pants, and they had a baby with them.

Officer Vences was asked which officer made the initial contact with Jermelle and Shanya. Officer Vences stated that Officer Courtier made the first contact. Officer Vences was then asked how he perceived the conversation was progressing between the couple and Officer Courtier. Officer Vences stated that the conversation appeared to be verbally escalating and he attempted to interject and de-escalate the situation. Officer Vences explained that to de-escalate the situation he asked Jermelle and Shanya how they arrived at the restaurant. Did they walk, did they drive, what car was their vehicle? Officer Vences stated he was attempting to provide them with a means to clear the suspicion that they were involved in the hit-and-run accident. Officer Vences stated that the couple was not cooperating with this line of questioning and stood up and attempted to leave.

Officer Vences was then asked if he recalled having an interaction with any Pleasant Prairie Police Officer or if he overheard either Sgt. Lodygowski or Officer Quilling state anything to Kenosha Police Officers while on scene. Officer Vences stated that all he remembered was a Pleasant Prairie officer stopped Jermelle and possibly expressed to Jermelle that he was legally detained.

Officer Vences was then shown his body-worn camera footage from when he entered the restaurant to approximately when Jermelle stood up and was stopped by PPPD Sgt. Lodygowski. While reviewing Officer Vences' body-worn camera footage he was asked if he remembered glasses being present on the table Jermelle and Shanya were seated at. He stated he did and that they appeared to be skinny flute-shaped glasses. When Officer Vences was shown his footage that provided the audio of Officer Quilling stating that Jermelle and Shanya were on scene when he first arrived with drinks on their table Officer Vences stated he didn't recall hearing Officer Quilling's statement. Officer Vences explained that his body camera was positioned on the left side of his chest and his attention was directed forward while his camera captured visuals to his left and right. Upon the second time Officer Quilling stated that he didn't believe Jermelle and Shanya were involved in the hit-and-run accident Officer Vences was asked if he recalled hearing this statement. Officer Vences stated that he didn't recall hearing him make the second statement because he could only hear his voice talking. It is reasonable to believe that Officer Vences didn't hear Officer Quilling the first time he stated that Jermelle and Shanya were likely not involved. His proximity to Officer Quilling wasn't as close as with other officers and it appeared to be loud inside the restaurant. It is not reasonable to believe that Officer Vences didn't hear Officer Quilling the second time because he responded to Officer Courtier. Officer Vences stated to Officer Courtier moments after the second declaration from Officer Quilling that because Officer Quilling arrived on scene with a delay it could be possible Jermelle and Shanya fled from the scene, entered the restaurant, ordered drinks and food all before Officer Quilling arrived at 2309hrs.

It was expressed to Officer Vences that I believed that he absorbed what Officer Quilling had stated and that is why he expressed to Officer Courtier that the delay of PPPD's arrival was a reasonable reason to continue to investigate Jermelle and Shanya. Upon expressing this information to Officer Vences he stated, "Well there was radio traffic that Prairie did go to Applebee's prior to us getting there and I believe it was added to the call notes." KPPA representative Deates asked for clarification regarding the delay in response Officer Vences was expressing. The timetable of events was then explained to everyone in the room. Officer Vences was then asked if he believed there could have been another avenue or means to determine when Jermelle and Shanya arrived on scene compared to when the crash occurred. Officer Vences responded, "Yeah, I mean it's possible. There are always different variables for different results and same results different options."

Officer Vences was then shown body-camera footage from Officer Courtier. Body-worn camera footage of Officer Quilling for the second time stating that he believed Jermelle and Shanya weren't involved in the hit-and-run accident was played. The clip continues with Officer Vences immediately reacting to this statement. This body camera footage was stopped and it was stated to Officer Vences that I believed that he heard Officer Quilling's statement causing him to react. Officer Vences stated, "Yeah, yeah, no, it makes more sense for the second time."

Officer Vences was then asked if at this point during the interaction with Jermelle and Shanya, he felt that he was working with only Officer Courtier. He agreed that it was the two of them working together. I then asked why Officer Vences didn't attempt to figure out another means to eliminate Jermelle and Shanya as suspects. Officer Vences stated that he felt he needed to stay with the couple because they were detained and he was trying to "buy time". Officer Vences stated that his positioning was designed to monitor Jermelle and Shanya because they were detained. Officer Vences was anticipating Officer Courtier would begin the process of trying to figure out another way to verify when Jermelle and Shanya entered the restaurant.

Officer Vences was then shown the last time Officer Quilling directly addressed Officer Courtier and stated again that he didn't believe Jermelle and Shanya were involved. Officer Vences was asked if he remembered Officer Quilling having that conversation with Officer Courtier. Officer Vences responded that he didn't recall hearing Officer Quilling make that statement. Officer Vences was then asked if he had that information would his actions have been different? He expressed that he would have relayed that info and would have focused on a different process to eliminate Jermelle and Shanya from suspicion of being involved in a hit-and-run accident.

It was expressed to Officer Vences that this is an open investigation, and he is not to talk about any aspects of the call for service, investigation, or interview. The interview concluded at 1604hrs.

Through my review, I believe that Officer Vences' use of force, report writing, and investigative techniques violated numerous policies. These Kenosha Police Policies include:

1.1 Mission, Vision, and Core Values of the Kenosha Police Department

The mission of the Kenosha Police Department is: "To Strengthen and Serve our Community by Putting People First."

Officer Vences failed to follow the mission of the Kenosha Police Department through the use of force he utilized on this call.

1.3 Use of Force

See Sgt. Hancock's report regarding numerous strikes being administered to Jermelle that he was unable to find any articulable or justifiable reasoning for being delivered.

41.10 Police Reports - Completion, Submission, Approval and Distribution.

"It is the policy of the Kenosha Police Department to document reported and suspected crimes and criminal activity occurring within its jurisdiction. Additionally, certain non-criminal events, situations, and circumstances will also be documented. Employees will

conduct a thorough, comprehensive, and complete preliminary investigation. Employees will complete any and all additional paperwork required.”

Officer Vences authored a report that was incomplete and inaccurate. Events that occurred during his use of force were not properly documented. See Sgt. Hancock’s report for further info.

Conclusion

This case had numerous challenges that were unique and ultimately created conflict and a less-than-desirable outcome. Officers were provided partially accurate and partially inaccurate information from multiple witnesses on scene. This is common in many of the cases law enforcement investigate but, with the witnesses involved in this case, their descriptions of the suspects were coincidentally similar to that of non-involved parties. It is still unclear how witnesses determined that a female in the group was wearing red with a bun in her hair and a scarf when none of the involved parties match this description. Also, Officers encountered four different timeframes of when Jermelle and Shanya arrived on scene; just now from dispatch, twenty to thirty minutes from Applebee’s management and one hour and forty-five minutes from Jermelle.

Additionally, officers on scene were immediately engaged in a confrontation with Jermelle and Shanya who were not forthcoming, were not fully cooperative, and could have de-escalated the situation by answering questions and providing information requested from Officers Vences and Courtier. Jermelle and Shanya also chose to engage in physical resistance when officers attempted to lawfully detain them. Their behavior should not go unnoticed even though Kenosha Police Officers failed to provide a level of service and professionalism the citizens of the City of Kenosha expect and require from all members of this department.

Though Officer Courtier and Officer Vences received resistive and uncooperative verbal communication from Jermelle and Shanya, their failure to work through this situation ultimately resulted in the use of force that was partially deemed unreasonable. As Kenosha Police Officers, we are held to our mission, vision, and core values. This includes adhering to our policies, practices, and standards to continuously improve to ensure that we provide the highest level of service to our community. A pivotal part of these standards is our ability to be excellent problem solvers and find solutions when others cannot. Officers Vences and Officer Courtier failed to explore alternative means to achieve their ultimate goal of locating and arresting the suspects involved in the hit-and-run accident.

This failure to use common sense and provide competent police service led to the use of force on two subjects, a failure to provide medical care to one involved party, and unreasonable force towards another party. Officer Courtier’s verbal communication throughout this call did not assist in de-escalation. He also engaged in banter with Shanya that was rude and could be deemed as malicious.

Officer Vences and Officer Courtier didn't react and move his attention away from Jermelle and Shanya when Officer Quilling stated that he believed the couple weren't involved in the hit-and-run accident. Officer Vences did not process the use of force scene appropriately and ultimately used unreasonable force on five of his eleven use of force decisions that Sgt. Hancock characterized as "[partially having] no articulable reason why that force was being used.". His behavior was not what we strive for and citizens of the City of Kenosha expect and require from Officers of the Kenosha Police Department.

Once the force used upon Jermelle and Shanya was complete, Officers Vences and Officer Courtier had very different demeanors and responses. Officer Vences de-escalated quickly and calmly cared for Jermelle. His medical treatment was appropriate and within policy. He also displayed an ability to not personalize the events by acting professional and without heightened emotion. Officer Courtier had the opposite response compared to officer Vences. Though Officer Courtier did say in his interview that the actions against Shanya were never intended as punishment, he still showed signs of being overly emotionally affected by the use of force and defiant behavior present to him by Jermelle and Shanya. He was argumentative with Shanya and declared her as a combative inmate during his transportation to the Kenosha County Jail. This declaration caused a response of nine law enforcement professionals to respond to the Sally Port to assist Officer Courtier. Further, Officer Courtier ultimately failed to render Shanya medical care for over thirty minutes.

I believe the actions of Officers Courtier and Vences fail to meet the standards outlined in our mission, vision, and core values. These officers failed to put people first. They failed to show respect, proper integrity, superior service, and they failed to be examples of excellence. I am recommending the steps of progressive discipline be followed for both Officer Courtier and Officer Vences.

NARRATIVE

On 07/20/2023 at 2257 hours, I, Officer Riser #782 was dispatch to an Injury Accident in the 7500 block of STH 31, City of Kenosha. Dispatch advised a vehicle had rolled over. I was in marked patrol squad 3441 and in my department issued uniform. BWC was activated.

I activated my emergency lights and siren and began responding to the area. Upon arrival, I observed a black SUV bearing [REDACTED] flipped upside down. The bottom of the vehicle was in the air and the roof was on the ground. I observed personal belongings all over the road that came from the vehicle. I then observed a red honda civic bearing [REDACTED] in lane 1 facing westbound. The vehicle had heavy front end damage and it appeared no one was inside. I went up to the vehicle and observed it was abandon and the keys were still in the vehicle.

I observed a male and female in their car stopped at the red light say the people in the vehicle ran westbound. I was advised it was 4 people who ran; a female with a baby and three males. witness advised they were African American males and the female was also African American. The witness stated they believed the female was wearing a scarf and she was wearing red.

Another witness who had a Texas Roadhouse uniform then came over and stated she thought the female was wearing red as well. The female in the uniform stayed to make a statement but the witness in the vehicle stated they did not observe the crash and did not stay to make a statement.

I advised other officers enroute to block traffic due to the vehicles being a traffic hazard. I also advised officers the descriptions of the people who ran from the scene and the direction they went.

I went and spoke with the operator of the black SUV. She was crying and was holding her son who was also in the vehicle. The female was identified with an IL DL as Genesis Cruz.. Cruz's son was verbally identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was not injured and was in a car seat. I asked Cruz if she was injured and she stated she did not think so. I told Cruz rescue was still going to come to check her out just in case.

When I asked Cruz was happened she stated the accident was her fault. Cruz advised she was driving eastbound and thought the left turn lane to go northbound was blocked off with construction cones so she decided to make a left turn in a lane that she was not suppose to. Cruz stated she then began the turn and then observed the red sedan but it was too late to avoid it and the struck her vehicle.

Although Cruz had a green light, the green light was for vehicles that were not turning and would still be going eastbound. The left turn lane had 2 left turn lanes and only one was closed with construction. Any vehicle that was in the left turn lane was stopped due to them having a red light.

I began doing an article search in the abandoned vehicle. The vehicle had a very strong odor of marijuana. I did not locate any thing that could identify who was in the vehicle.

Rescue arrived on scene and began assessing Cruz and Mendez. Rescue advised due to Cruz being pregnant they would be transporting her to Froedert South Hospital.

Checks were conducted on Cruz and dispatch advised she had a misdemeanor warrant out of Kenosha Joint Services and her bond would be \$300. At this time, Cruz was already in route to the hospital.

Officer Tripp #786 arrived on scene as my cover officer [REDACTED] began taking pictures and speaking to the witness in the Texas Roadhouse uniform. Please see his report for further details.

I heard on the radio other officers believed they were out with people from the accident at Applebees. Officers then advised there was an active fight at Applebees.

Shortly after I was advised to go to Applebees in attempt to see if any of the people matched the description given.

While I was at Applebees, I observed a vehicle arrive and a female walked up to myself. I asked her if I could help her and she stated she was the owner of the Honda Civic that was involved in the accident. The female was verbally identified as Maleah Trull. I asked Trull who was driving her vehicle and she stated she did not know. I advised Trull that the incident in a possible felony and she could suffer the consequences since it is her vehicle. Trull stated she knew who had her vehicle and she would tell me what she knew.

Trull advised she was at work at St. Cats and received a text message from "Janiah" who advised her they just got into an accident and the ran away from it. Janiah also sent a text message to Trull and told her to report her vehicle stolen. Trull advised she then called her mom to pick her up and while her mom was on the way, she observed her daughters car and told her where the police were. I then asked Trull if she knew who was driving her car and she stated "Jamonte" was. I asked how she knew that and she advised he was the one she allowed to borrow her vehicle and he was the one who dropped her off at work in her vehicle. A statement was completed with Trull.

Pictures were taken and uploaded of the text messaged Janiah sent to Trull.

I spoke with Officer Pruett 684 who advised he learned Jamonte was driving as well and would be taken into custody for hit and run causing injury.

I then went to the hospital to speak with Cruz. Officer Pittman #781 was able to take a statement from Cruz, please see his report for further details. Cruz also advised she no longer had insurance.

I issued and explained Cruz three citations; OWS- BI77513, No insurance-BI775115, and Failure to Yield Right away from a Left Turn- BI775114.

I advised Cruz she had a warrant for her arrest. She began crying and was very surprised. Cruz stated she had the money to bond out. I was notified at the hospital Cruz had bruising on her back, shoulder, chest, stated her face was sore and possible swollen, and she also had a few scratches on her leg.

Cruz's mother Claudia Velasquez arrived at the hospital to watch Cruz's son. Since I knew I would be taking Cruz into custody, I contacted Access and advised them of the situation. It was determined by Access work Alethea Gray-Bates that [REDACTED] would be allowed to go with Cruz's mother.

Once Cruz was released from the hospital she was searched and placed into handcuffs. Before leaving the hospital, I received a medical release form for the jail. The handcuffs were safety locked and checked for proper fit. I transported to Cruz to Kenosha County Jail. All jail paperwork was completed.

Once at the jail, Cruz began throwing up and stated she thought she was going to faint. Although Cruz could bond out right away, the jail was very busy and she would be waiting for about an hour still. Due to Cruz being sick it was determined she would be finger printed and pictured at the jail, then I would transport her to the front counter to bond out.

Once Cruz was booked, I transported her to the front counter where she posted bail and was released.

While at the jail, I also issued and explained Jamonte Wright two citations; OWS- BI775116 and No insurance-BI775117. Wright advised he understood and did not have any other questions.

Please see other officers reports regarding crash doc, arrest, and statements. Both vehicles were also removed by Jantz towing.

NARRATIVE

On 07/20/2023 at approximately 2306 hrs I, P.O. Roepke #696 along with P.O. Karaway #732, were patrolling in marked KPD squad #3448 and wearing full KPD patrol uniform. BWC active. We responded to Applebees, 6950 75th St, reference an Accident investigation. See report 2023-00039079. It was advised that the suspects in this case were African American and possibly had a child with them.

Upon arrival P.O. Courtier #661 and P.O. Vences #686 were speaking with a couple that were sitting on the south side of the restaurant near a window. As Officers were speaking with these subjects I decided to continue searching the restaurant for other potential suspects. I made my way to the mens bathroom to check it for persons as there appeared to be very little people in the restaurant at this time. As I opened the bathroom door I observed approximately five people congregating in the restroom. As I was attempting to identify these people I heard Officers advise that there was an active fight happening in the restaurant.

I made my way out of the bathroom in order to assist Officers. I could hear a woman yelling at this time. I made my way back into the main restaurant area and observed P.O. Courtier struggling with a female/ black. She was later identified as Shanya Boyd. Boyd was the same female that Officers were originally speaking to. I observed this female to have climbed up on top of the booth. P.O. Courtier was actively attempting to place this female in custody. I observed her to brace her body up against the window and actively push against the seat in order to keep her distance from P.O. Courtier. I observed him to have hold of her arm and he was attempting to bring her down. I could see Boyd actively pulling her arm away from P.O. Courtier as he was giving her multiple commands. As I observed Boyd to be actively resisting P.O. Courtier's attempts to place her into custody I then went to assist him. I climbed onto the seat of the booth and took hold of her left arm over her bicep and forearm. I then attempted to remove her from her position of height as she was perched on top of the booth seat. I could feel the resistive tension in her arm as Boyd continued to actively pull her arm away from me. Officers and I were able to pull her down off the booth seat and attempted to stabilize her against a table. Boyd continued to actively resist Officer's attempts to place her hands behind her back. Due to the small confined space of where we were located and her continued active resistance it was determined that we she needed to be placed on the ground for further stabilization.

The table was removed for space. Officers and myself were able to direct her to the ground at this point. Boyd continued to actively resist my efforts to place her left hand behind her back. I could feel her pulling her arm pulling away from however I was finally able to place it behind her back where Officers were able to secure her into handcuffs. During the arrest of Boyd OC spray was deployed. Once she was safely into custody I assisted in escorting her to the P.O. Courtier's squad. During this time Boyd continued to yell and scream. She had to be stabilized against the squad during our search incident to arrest in order to conduct our search thoroughly. Boyd was then placed in P.O. Courtier's squad and turned over to him to be transported to the KCJ.

The male that Boyd was with was identified as Jermelle L. English. Jermelle and Boyd had their child with him during the time of this incident as well. The child was identified as [REDACTED]. Both Jermelle and Boyd were placed into custody reference this incident. Due to them both being placed into custody CPS Access was contacted. I spoke with Althea Gray-Bates. Consent was obtained from Boyd for [REDACTED] to go with his godfather, Cole Peterson (verbal). Boyd originally wanted him to go with her mother who was identified as Tekesisha Boyd (verbal). Due to Tekesisha living in the state of Illinois and this incident happening in the state of Wisconsin, Gray-Bates advised this would not be okay. It was determined that the child would go with Cole. It should be noted that Tekesisha was highly uncooperative yelling/screaming at Officers during most of our interaction.

[REDACTED] was transported to Frodtert Pleasant Prairie Campus, 9555 76th St, to be checked out as a precautionary method. It was determined that [REDACTED] was unharmed and had no diagnosable injuries. He was seen by Dr. Patterson.

Gray-Bates took custody of [REDACTED] and transported him to [REDACTED] to Cole's residence. We followed to facilitate the transfer of custody. Upon arrival, his residence was deemed appropriate and Gray-Bates relinquished custody to Cole.

Boyd's bag of baby supplies was left behind at Applebees when she was taken into custody. We took custody of this bag prior to leaving Applebees. It contained her phone as well as keys. The keys and phone were turned over to KCJ. They refused to take the bag stating that it would have to go to evidence for safekeeping. I later placed the bag into evidence locker #33 for safekeeping. A search of the bag yielded nothing of evidentiary value and was all miscellaneous baby items.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On 08-18-23 at 1017Hrs I, Lt. Jurgens #553 had a search warrant signed by court commissioner William Michel for video evidence from Applebee's (6950 75St) related to the hit-and-run accident. The warrant requested video evidence and surveillance equipment if necessary. At 1115hrs I served the warrant at the restaurant and obtained six video clips via my Kenosha Police Department email with anticipation of being provided the surveillance system hard drive on Monday 08-21-23. The six video clips were put onto a disc and placed into evidence.

The video footage from the interior of Applebee's provided evidence of when Jermelle and Shanya entered the restaurant and when the suspects entered the restaurant. It should be noted that the timestamps on the video footage from Applebee's are incorrect. The appropriate time was determined by synching body-worn camera footage of Officer Karaway clearing the women's bathroom with the internal surveillance footage from Applebee's. Our body-worn cameras are synched to central standard time when they are docked for uploading and charging. The Applebee's footage shows Officer Karaway knocking on the female bathroom door at 2259hrs and Officer Karaway's body-worn camera footage shows a timestamp of 2320hrs when he completes this act. For the remainder of this report I will reference to adjusted times of 21 minutes past the timestamps indicated on Applebee's surveillance footage.

At approximately 2205hrs Jermelle and Shanya entered through the front entrance of the restaurant. Shanya is carrying a purse and another bag that is likely a diaper bag. Jermelle is carrying their child. They wait at the host stand, are greeted, and are escorted to the upper section on the south side of the restaurant. This footage was observed through channel 4 of Applebee's camera footage.

At 2301hrs two individuals I believe were employees are observed standing and talking at a point-of-sale system near the to-go entrance of the restaurant. They are facing each other standing facing east and west. At 2340:10 the suspects begin to enter through the to-go entrance of the restaurant. Five subjects entered through this door and all entered into the men's bathroom in a single file line. I believe that the subject carrying Marc Garrett was Janiah D. Washington.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On 7/20/23 at approximately 2301hrs, I, PO Maccari #634, along with PO Thorpe #735, while in full KPD uniform/unmarked squad #3264 (video/bwc), responded to the area of STH31 / STH 50 to assist officers investigating an injury vehicle accident where several subjects reportedly ran from the scene north/west.

I began to check the area and heard officers call out at Applebees (6950 75ST). We responded there and parked to the north in case they needed assistance or suspects ran outside. I heard unusual radio noise as if someone keyed up to talk but nothing came through. I then pulled in to the lot and ran in to Applebees.

Along the south wall of the restaurant in the dining area, I observed officers in a physical altercation with a subject wearing a white shirt. I began yelling for this person to stop resisting and identified as Kenosha Police. It appeared officers were gaining control. I could smell oleoresin capsicum residue in the air.

I heard what sounded like additional fighting (thuds/pounding) to the north of me. I looked up and observed what appeared to be a physical altercation. I responded over there and found officers struggling with a male/black.

A male/white was close to officers recording. He was ordered and directed back and advised he could record but needed to allow space for officers. I stayed between him and officers until relieved by PPPD. A female/white employee began to speak to me about the incident.

I was then tasked with staying with a young male involved in the altercation. I requested that the med unit respond in emergency mode. A female/black, who refused to identify herself, was holding the child. I learned she was an employee at Applebees who was caring for the child. PO Roepke #696 would take over this task as I needed to interview two employees.

I interviewed two employees, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] provided a written statement of the following: A male/black, female/black, and a baby came in and were self seated. [REDACTED] went to their table to take their order. The female ordered an alcoholic drink. Shortly after, a police officer came in to Applebees. The officer then left. The couple then changed their order to "to go." They seemed to be staring at police. They seemed nervous / jumpy. [REDACTED] told her manager, Jen, that they should call the police back because this group matched the description of who they were looking for and they were super nervous. Just brought up what if this kid was kidnapped or in trouble etc... Jen decided they could call the police back and Jen did so. It seemed as if the male used the baby as a shield or defense so the police wouldn't talk to or touch him. See her written statement.

[REDACTED] provided a written statement of the following: An officer came in and asked [REDACTED] if a male/black, female/black, and a baby had come in within the past five minutes. There was a group

matching this description sitting along the south wall of the restaurant, but they had been here for about 15-20 minutes already. The officer did not see them and [REDACTED] didn't mention them due to the time line. The officer left. The male and female asked for their order "to go." [REDACTED] and employees discussed whether or not this group was who the officer was looking for. The group seemed to be staring at the employees as they spoke. The police came back and now made contact with that male, female, and baby. The male stood up and grabbed the baby and began to walk away from the police. The police blocked his path and the male went the other way, so officers again went to block his path. That is when things escalated. Prior to the male getting up, [REDACTED] heard the officer asking them what kind of car they drove. [REDACTED] remembered the officer asking again when the male tried to leave and explained it was a simple question. When the struggle began, it appeared the priority was keeping the baby safe and separating the male/baby. [REDACTED] never left the bar area between the time the police left and came back. See his statement. [REDACTED] showed me a receipt for the female's drink order, which was placed at 2242hrs.

I cleared with this report.

On 07-20-2023 at approximately 2257 hrs, I, PO Pruettt #684 (full uniform, unit 3382, BWC activated) self dispatched to an accident involving injuries at hwy 50 and Greenbay rd. I was advised 4 male blacks and 1 female black fled the scene holding a baby.

Upon my arrival, I began to check the area northwest of the accident. I was advised PPPD checked one of the two businesses lobbies that were open at the time. The business that was checked by PPPD Applebees (6950 75th St). PPPD advised they did not see anyone matching the description. Cinemark (TinselTown USA) movie theater 7010 70th Ct. is the other business that was open at this time. PO Riser #782 advised the vehicle that the subjects fled from had a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle.

I was advised by dispatch that Applebees called and stated a family with a baby was acting suspicious. I observed the couple on the south side of the building inside eating at a table. I then went to check the bathroom on the north side of the building. I entered the male bathroom and observed 4 male blacks and one female black in the bathroom. The bathroom smelled strongly of unburnt marijuana. It should also be known that the accident was called in at 2257 and the restaurant closes at 2300 hrs. I located these males and female after close. I also asked staff at Applebees if any of the subjects in the bathroom were patrons. The staff stated none of the subjects in the bathroom currently had a table or was being waited on.

In the this bathroom I observed Janiah Washington (Verbal ID), Kevin Thomas (Verbal ID), [REDACTED] (Verbal ID), Jamonte Wright (Verbal ID), and Marc Garrett (Verbal ID). Marc is paralyzed from the waist down and was sitting in the handicap stall. [REDACTED] was in the stall next to Marc with the door shut and locked. Janiah, Kevin, and Jamonte were next to the sinks. I know Kevin and Janiah to carry firearms, and I am also aware of Marc posting photos with weapons on social media. I also only had myself and 2 other officers in the bathroom, due to the accident and high call volume. I immediately handcuffed Janiah and Kevin and searched them, and I did not find anything illegal at this time on them. Janiah and Kevin were detained in handcuffs due officer subject factor and their known associations with weapons and gang members. All subjects in the bathroom were searched under the Carroll doctrine, based on the smell emanating from the bathroom, close proximity of the accident, and matching the descriptions given by witnesses. There was nothing illegal found at this time on their person.

Applebees employee stated she did have access to the video cameras. I observed at approximately 2257 hrs, Janiah, Kevin, [REDACTED], Jamonte and Marc enter the east entrance side door and walk immediately to the bathroom and not exit. It should also be known one of the males was carrying Marc like a child due to Marc not being able to walk. It appeared very similar as to how babies are held.

I went back to speak with each subject individually. I spoke with Kevin outside of the bathroom and

read him Miranda. Kevin understood his rights and wished to speak with me. Kevin stated we was knocked out and did not know who was driving. I asked Kevin when he was picked up to go in the car who was driving, and Kevin stated he did not know, that he was asleep. Kevin said he did not know who was driving, but it was not Jannah. Kevin could not recall who was driving the motor vehicle prior to the accident nor who was driving it during. Kevin did stated he was in an accident and did leave the scene. Kevin had glassy blood shot eyes and smelled of marijuana and appeared to be under the influence of marijuana. Kevin was wearing a tan/gray shirt and jeans. Kevin was placed in the back of my squad.

I then spoke with Jamonte. I read Jamonte his Miranda rights and he stated he did not want to talk to me. Jamonte was wearing a red shirt with black jeans. I placed Jamonte with one hand behind his back and handcuffed him to the opposite side of his right hand on the belt loop of his pants. This was done this way due to Jamonte having a fractured wrist in a brace. This injury was not related to this accident. Jamonte was placed in the back PO Vences #686 squad.

I lastly spoke to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was wearing a white t shirt, a turquoise hooded sweat shirt, and light blue wash jeans. I told [REDACTED] he was not under arrest. [REDACTED] was not in handcuffs at this time. I explained to [REDACTED] the situation and as to why he was being detained. [REDACTED] stated Jamonte was driving the vehicle. [REDACTED] repeatedly stated Jamonte was driving the vehicle. [REDACTED] was taken to a PPPD squad and later released.

Jannah was also released from the scene as well.

I was advised the R/O of the suspects vehicle was receiving text messages from Jannah stating "we wrecked your car." Jamonte's phone was taken for evidence and placed in the temporary storage locker #4. Based on the subjects texting after the accident, I believe evidence of the hit and run was on the phone of Jamonte.

Jamonte stated in the jail without prompting that "we had the green light." Based on that statement there is reason to believe that Jamonte was in the vehicle at the time of the accident. Also based on my experience typically it is the responsibility of the driver of the vehicle to be observing the status of controlled intersections.

Jamonte was taken to KCJ and turned over to staff without incident.

The arrest sheet was completed.

I also contacted P&P after hours for Kevin Thomas. P&P advised a hold would be placed on Kevin at this time. I was not in contact with Kevin as he was released on scene. The call was delayed to P&P given the dynamic situation at Applebees.

No further information at this time.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On Thursday, 07-20-2023, I, Officer Thorpe #735, was assigned to third shift patrol from 2200 hrs - 0600 hrs, in full uniform and unmarked SQ #3264, with Officer Maccari #634. My SQ's Audio / Video REC was active on this call. I was wearing my assigned BWC: BWC2-41920. My BWC's Audio / Video REC was active on this call. Both SQ and BWC were tested prior to the start of my shift and were shown to be working properly.

At approximately 2305 hours, PO Maccari #634 and I, as well as multiple other officers responded to a two vehicle accident with injuries at the intersection of 75th St and Green Bay Rd. Dispatch advised that one vehicle had rolled over. While responding to the location, dispatch advised that multiple witnesses were providing multiple descriptions of 3-4 people running from the accident westbound on 75th St.

Upon our arrival, we began to check the area for the suspects. Officers began checking businesses in the area. Dispatch advised that a worker at Applebee's 6950 75th St believed that the suspects were in the establishment. Multiple officers responded to this location. PO Maccari #634 and I waited outside to see if any suspects would flee once officers entered Applebee's. While on perimeter, officers inside advised that there was a fight inside. Myself and PO Maccari #634 responded.

I entered Applebee's and observed multiple officers attempting to handcuff a female who was actively resisting them, on the south side of the dining area in the restaurant. I approached them and advised them to decentralize the female to the ground. The female then braced herself against a table so that officers could not safely decentralize her. I pulled the table away from the female and officers were effectively able to decentralize the female and handcuff her. Once the female was handcuffed. I observed other officers trying to handcuff a male who was actively resisting them. There was a small group of Applebee's staff surrounding them. I then ran over to the officers with the male and began to move the staff away from the officers. Once the male was handcuffed, I called for a Med unit to respond to treat both the male and the female.

While waiting for the Med unit, I was informed that officers were with multiple subjects in the men's bathroom. I then responded to the bathroom to assist officers.

The subjects in the bathroom were identified verbally as the following:

- Jannah D Washington
- Jamonte D Wright
- Marc A Garrett

I stood by with the above subjects in the bathroom while other officers conducted their investigation. After a short period of time, it was found that all 5 subjects had not been seated in the restaurant and had entered through the east side door and went directly into the bathroom, a short time after the crash. PO Pruett #684 removed Kevin, Jamonte and [REDACTED] from the bathroom and spoke to each of them individual. It was determined by PO Pruett #684 that Jamonte was the driver. Marc was released from his detention a short time afterwards as Marc is a paraplegic and cannot operate a motor vehicle.

Janiah was detained in order to contact Det. Krein #564 in reference to her being a suspect in case # 2023-00034241. I was unable to make contact with Det. Krein #564 and I was advised that Janiah must be released, but to seize her phone as evidence under case #: 2023-00034241. For more information in regards to this, see reports under case #: 2023-00034241.

A 375 ml bottle of Milagro Tequila was located in the bathroom. The bottle was nearly full with the liquid coming up to just below the neck of the bottle. Photographs of the bottle were taken, by myself, and the bottle was disposed of.

I attempted to obtain the surveillance footage from all 5 subjects entering the Applebee's through the east side door and then going into the bathroom, but could not. I recorded a 20 second video of the 5 subjects entering the Applebee's on my department issued camera. I later uploaded the video and photos under this case number. The surveillance camera did not have a timestamp, from what I could see. The only identifier in the video was "Channel01" transcribed in the top left corner of the video. I was advised by the manager that was "camera 1". The footage shows, the 5 subjects listed above enter the east door, one of which is carrying Marc, and immediately enter the men's bathroom.

Follow up will be needed to collect the surveillance footage from Applebee's.

This ends my involvement in the case.

On 07-21-2023 at about 2312 hours I, PO Karaway 732, was on duty assigned to 3rd shift patrol with PO Roepke 696. At about that time we were checking Applebees (6950 70th street, Kenosha, WI) for suspects in a hit an run accident causing injury. Police had checked the restaurant shortly after the crash occurred. Dispatch advised that Applebees employees reported a black male and black female, with a baby, wanted to take their ordered food to go shortly after police checked the restaurant. This prompted us to investigate the restaurant.

This call took place during the hours of darkness. This call occurred indoors with soft interior lighting. I was wearing the Kenosha Police Department patrol uniform and driving marked squad 3448. Body worn and squad cameras active during this call.

We arrived with other officers and I heard staff advise other officers that his party arrived about a half hour prior. It was unknown to me if these people were involved and I went to check the bathrooms for the suspects.

While I was investigating the bathroom, I was advised of a fight happening in the restaurant area. I moved to the restaurant area and saw PO Courtier 661 standing on the seat of a booth attempting to place the black female I previously observed, later identified to me as Shanya C. Boyd (ver), into custody. She was standing on another seat of a booth with a leg propped on the back of the booth and her back pressed against the wall. Shanya was obviously bracing her body to overcome PO Courtier's attempts to control her. I could see PO Courtier was in physical contact with her arms.

The restaurant was open for business and had other customers. I could see what looked to be a crowd forming near the center area of the dining area. PO Courtier and Shanya were both standing on booths and faced a risk of falling during the struggle. I believed that a prolonged struggle to secure Shanya in handcuffs in this location would increase the risk of her or officers facing injury. I saw officers attempting to control a second resistive subject on the west side of the dining area. These circumstances were significant factors in my decisions during this call.

I climbed onto the table next to Shanya and pushed her away from the wall she was leaning against. I put myself between her and the wall and pushed her off the booth so officers could affect the arrest on a stable platform. I could feel Shanya pushing back against me as I tried to push her away from the wall. Shanya landed on her feet on the floor and continued to actively resist officer attempts to place her arms around her back. I attempted to conduct a control the head decentralization. Shanya continued moving, causing my hands to miss the target area. I suspected my hands made contact with the front of her neck, and I did not want to perform the decentralization from that position. I released my hands from Shanya.

This area had tables, chairs, and dining booths around us, limiting space and creating impact hazards. I grabbed Shanya's ankles and pulled them from out from underneath her. This caused

Shanya to fall to the ground and officers could complete the arrest. During this time I felt a liquid make contact with the right side of my head and right forearm. The liquid caused a burning sensations and I recognized it as OC spray. I realized OC spray had been deployed and I was exposed to its effects. I took control of Shanya's right arm from PO Courtier and secured her in handcuffs. Shanya was assisted by officers back onto her feet. We escorted her to a squad parked outside and I searched her incident to arrest. I found no contraband.

I transferred custody of Shanya to PO Courtier. PO Vences 686 was with the other resistive male, who was on an ambulance gurney. I secured that male in handcuffs to the gurney (checked for fit/safety locked). Due to the earlier level of resistance this male engaged in, I secured both hands to the gurney. PO Roepke and I later learned of a young child of the two people that were arrested, which was brought to Froedtert Pleasant Prairie. We responded to the hospital to facilitate placement of this child. Reference PO Roepke's report for further information.

This report ends my involvement with this case at this time.

Thomas, and Marc A. Garrett (all persons verbal ID). There are department communications and local records showing the above people as being involved in weapons related calls. Due to the close proximity to the scene of the crash, the restaurant being in the flight path reported by witnesses, and the unusual circumstances in which the party was discovered, they were all detained pending investigation. I remained with these subjects while officers conducted the investigation into the hit and run.

Upon arrival Officers began speaking to a couple with a child on the south side of the restaurant. While Officers began speaking with them P.O. Karaway and I began to check the rest of the restaurant for potential suspects. We made our way to the mens bathroom and opened it. Upon opening it I observed there to be multiple M/Bs that appeared to be in their late teens to early twenties hanging out in there. I also observed there to be one F/B hanging out in the bathroom. None of these individuals appeared to be utilizing the restroom for what they are intended for and appeared to just be hanging out.

We began identifying these people. I identifed one of them as Marc A. Garrett. Marc was sitting on the north side of the bathroom in the east most stall. I observed him to have his pants up and not actively utilizing the bathroom. Marc advised that he was just using the bathroom at this time. Marc also appeared to be paralyzed from the waist down. He stated that he was due to a gunshot wound some years ago. There was another M/B in the stall next to him at this time. This M/B right away advised that he was not with the other people. He was later identified as [REDACTED] Trull. [REDACTED] originally advised me that he was not with these people and that he was orginally at Tinseltown Movie theater tonight with a girl. He stated that he only came to Applebees to get picked up.

From prior experience I recognized the F/B as Janiah Washington. Janiah has known criminal past that invovles stolen vehicles and weapon related calls.

Due to another active situation happening within the restuarant I had to remove myself and deal with that. The persons in the restroom were left with Officers to deal with.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On 07-21-23, I PO Courtier #661 was on patrol in full KPD uniform operating marked squad 4002 with BWC recording. At approximately 2258 hours, I responded to the area of STH 50 and STH 31 for a rollover crash with subjects that had fled the scene. This was under case number 2023-39078.

Upon arrival, PO Riser #782 advised that male blacks and a female black with a baby ran toward Kohls or Menards. PO Riser advised that the female had a red shirt, with a bun on top of her head and a scarf.

I checked the area with other officers and was unable to locate anyone. At approximately 2311 hours, staff from Applebees, located at 6950 75th Street, which is in between Kohls and Menards, called into dispatch and advised that a group with a similar description came in and appeared nervous. The caller stated that there was a male and female with a baby and were sitting at the third table in.

I arrived to Applebees within seconds of this call with other officers including officers from Pleasant Prairie PD. I was directed by staff to the third booth on the south side of the restaurant, along the windows. This was the only seated table within the restaurant. I observed a female sitting facing toward the exit. This female, later ID via IL DL as Shanya Boyd, was wearing a white t shirt, dark pink pants, with a bun in her hair. The male was seated on the edge of the opposite booth at the table, holding a baby and was wearing a multicolored shirt with red shorts.

It has been a common occurrence through my career for witnesses to get parts of their descriptions mixed up or inverted, such as the female having red/pink pants instead of shirt. The fact that they had appeared nervous to the caller shortly after the accident, and the female having a bun and similar clothing, with a baby, made me strongly believe they were involved and were trying to evade police by entering Applebees.

I made contact with this couple and asked them if they were just involved in an accident. When they denied being in an accident, I asked how long they had been at Applebees, to which they replied about an hour and a half to an hour and 45 minutes. I asked them several times what car they arrived in but they stated they did not need to answer my questions and refused to tell me. I spoke with employees, including the manager, Jennifer Harris, who stated that this couple had only been at the restaurant for maybe 20 minutes and that this was in fact the table that they had called police for.

As officers were still trying to investigate whether or not this couple was involved in the hit and run, the male half got up and began walking toward the exit. I informed him he was detained and not free to go. The male told me he was free to go and proceeded to try and walk past officers. Once again, I told him to just let us know what car he came in and we would be done investigating, but he still refused. At this time, Shanya approached me from behind and I told her to stay back. As

the male half then retreated backward with PO Vences #686 following him, I ordered Shanya to stay back and she told me no. Shanya was in close proximity to PO Vences and she was continuing to escalate her behavior. I then placed my hands on Shanya's right arm to prevent her from walking with the male and behind PO Vences. Shanya pulled her arm away from me at which time I told her she was now under arrest and directed her into the side of a booth as she was defying my direct lawful order. I attempted to place Shanya's arm behind her back to place her into handcuffs. As I placed the right handcuff on her wrist, she began screaming loudly and then stood up on the booth. As I was trying to hold onto the handcuff so that Shanya could not use it as a weapon, she began to try and push me off of her and swing her arms toward my face as she was doing so. I could not get my balance as we stood on the booth cushion and I tried to wrap my left arm around Shanya's backside to direct her off the booth, but she went backward into the window. I could not grab any other part of Shanya other than bun of her hair to try and pull her head forward to gain access to her backside. Shanya stepped over the back of the booth and continued to try and break free from my grip that I still had on her and continued to swing her left arm toward me, as well as kicking her legs, making me fearful I was going to get struck in the face.

PO Roepke #696 arrived around this point and we directed Shanya to the ground. During this process, numerous dishes were knocked off of the table and chairs were flipped over. Shanya still continued to actively resist numerous officers. Needing to stop the continued active resistance, I deployed my department issued oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray into Shanya's face. At this time, we were able to take Shanya into custody. Shanya was escorted outside and placed in the rear seat of my squad car. I had retrieved her striped purse and located her IL DL inside. I also located a baggie of a green leafy substance that was consistent with marijuana based on my training and experience. My training and experience consists of 7 years as a law enforcement officer and involvement in numerous drug investigations. I seized this as evidence.

It was later determined that the couple was not involved with the crash.

I transported Shanya to the Kenosha County Jail where she was held on the following:

946.41(1) ; RESIST POLICE

946.41(1) ; OBSTRUCT POLICE

947.01(1) ; DISORDERLY CONDUCT

961.41(3G)(E) ; POSSESS MARIJUANA

Shanya had not open cases, was not on DOC supervision, and had no prior convictions in WI.

I returned to the KPD evidence bureau where I weighted the suspected marijuana using an AWS-70 scale which revealed a weight of 3.08 grams. I then tested a small amount of the

substance using a Duquenois Levine Reagent Nik E test kit which revealed the presence of THC. I packaged and placed the marijuana into evidence.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On 07-20-2023 at approximately 2349hrs, I PO Pittman #781 in full KPD uniform operating marked squad #4092 (BWC/SQD) video available. I responded to ST. Catherine's hospital ER #6 to assist officers with transporting Genesis T. Cruz (VER) from ST. Catherine's to the Kenosha County Jail (KCJ).

I was advised that Cruz's vehicle was involved in an accident that occurred at the intersection of 75th St and Green Bay Rd. Cruz appeared to be in pain. I observed red marks to the left side of her face, near her eye. Cruz advised she felt pain in her back, left shoulder and that she had bruising to her chest area. Without being questioned Cruz advised that a sedan struck her vehicle, causing her vehicle to flip. Cruz said the sedan that struck her vehicle left the area and never checked to see if she was okay.

Cruz provided me with the following signed written statement.

Cruz advised on 07-20-2023 at approximately 2252hrs, she was leaving the area of Chick-Fil-A in her black 2013 Cadillac SRX. Cruz said that she was driving E/B on 75th St and that she stopped her vehicle at the intersection of 75th ST and Green Bay Rd as she had a red traffic signal. Cruz said she believed her traffic signal was about to change from red to green, so she started to drive her vehicle forward.

Cruz advised she was attempting to turn N/B on to Green Bay Rd from 75th St. Cruz said while she was attempting to turn on to Green Bay Rd, she was aware that she was not in the turning lane. Cruz said while making the turn on to Green Bay Rd, she noticed a burgundy sedan driving at a high rate of speed W/B on 75th St. Cruz advised she attempted to turn on to Green Bay Rd to avoid contact with the sedan driving at a high rate of speed. Cruz said the sedan struck her vehicle on the passenger side causing her vehicle with her and her [REDACTED] (VER), in the back seat to flip on its top.

Cruz could not recall if the sedan's initial contact with her vehicle was to the front or to the rear of her vehicle. Cruz advised she was caused pain by this vehicle accident. Cruz stated that she did not give anyone consent to damage her vehicle or to cause her pain. Cruz advised she wished to pursue a complaint for the damage to her vehicle and the pain she endured.

Cruz signed an Informed Consent for Disclosure of Patient Health Care Information form for herself as well as her son [REDACTED]. I explained and provided Cruz with a Victims Rights Form. Cruz was turned over from my custody to PO Riser #782 (see her report) and transported to KCJ.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On 07/20/2023 at approximately 2257hrs, I PO Tripp #786 and PO Newell #727 were in full KPD uniform in marked squad #3381 (SQD/BWC recording). While on patrol, we responded to the intersection of 75th Street and Green Bay Road for a report of an accident with injuries. While en route to the call, we were advised that four suspects were seen running Westbound from the scene of the accident.

Upon arrival, I observed a black Cadillac SUV [REDACTED] rolled onto its roof perpendicular with the lanes of traffic, in lane #1 of the Northbound traffic lanes of Green Bay Road, on the North side of the intersection. I observed debris from the vehicle as well as what appeared to be ejected contents from the vehicle scattered across lanes #1-3 in the Northbound traffic lanes Green Bay Road. I also observed a red Honda Sedan [REDACTED] parked in lane #1 of the Westbound traffic lanes of 75th Street just West of the intersection. There was also a bumper in the middle of the intersection.

Upon approaching the intersection I observed a group of females on the median of Green Bay Road, just North of the intersection. A woman, later identified as Genesis Cruz DOB: [REDACTED] 1992, was sitting on the curb holding a child, later Identified as her son, [REDACTED]. She was surrounded by three other females who appeared to be checking on her. Genesis said that her and her son were ok. When checking in with the other females on scene, one female, later identified as Olivia Steele DOB: [REDACTED] 2004 (Verbal ID) stated that she was ok and she had witnessed the accident.

I then took photographs of the black Cadillac SUV and the Red Honda Sedan. Upon approaching the Honda, I observed no occupants inside the vehicle or anyone around it. As I photographed the Honda, I observed the vehicle's driver and passenger front airbags were deployed, the vehicle was missing its front bumper, had substantial fresh passenger side front fender damage, and a cracked windshield from top to bottom on the passenger side. I also observed an uncapped and open bottle of alcohol on the driver's seat of the vehicle which appeared to have some liquid remaining inside. Due to the severity of the accident and that no driver or occupants were identified from the Honda, I called for an Evidence Technician to process the vehicle.

I then spoke with Olivia to get perspective on what had happened. Olivia stated that she was driving Eastbound on Highway 50 approaching the intersection of Highway 50 and Green Bay Road. Olivia said that the light was red and the vehicle in front of her (The Cadillac) had its left hand turning signal on. Olivia stated that the vehicle (The Cadillac) was in the Eastbound lane, not one of the two turning lanes to the left, separated by a median (Lane #3). Olivia said that the East bound lights turned green, but there was a red arrow for turning Northbound onto Green Bay Road.

Olivia Stated that the vehicle (The Cadillac) began to pull forward into the middle of the intersection to turn North onto Green Bay Road. Olivia said the vehicle (The Cadillac) almost pulled into a

westbound lane (Westbound Lane #1), hitting the breaks but not coming to a complete stop. Olivia said that it appeared that the driver was trying to decide whether to make the turn or not, before they attempted to speed through the intersection and complete the turn onto Green Bay Road.

Olivia stated that it was while the vehicle (The Cadillac) was trying to make the turn that they were struck by another vehicle (The Honda). Olivia said that the struck vehicle (The Cadillac) rolled onto its roof in the Northbound lanes of Green Bay Road. Olivia said that the other vehicle (The Honda) continued West bound before coming to a complete stop in the left most lane of Highway 50 (Lane #1), just West of the intersection.

Olivia said that she called 911 as soon as she could, before putting her hazards on and getting out of her car to check on people. Olivia stated that everyone from the red sedan that was just West of the intersection was outside the car conversing around the car. Olivia said that she saw three to four people outside the car. Olivia stated that there were three black males and one black female. Olivia stated that the female was in a red shirt but she couldn't recall much more from that. Olivia said she asked if they were ok and they said that they were good.

Olivia said she then looked over at the flipped over vehicle (The Cadillac) and she saw what she believed to be a baby stroller. Olivia said that she then ran over to the flipped over car's driver side where her and a white male, with brown hair and 5'9" in height", helped get passengers out of the vehicle. Olivia said that from the back of the vehicle, her and the man grabbed the child of the driver, before grabbing the driver from the vehicle.

Olivia said that the 911 operator asked if anyone else was hurt besides the occupants of the flipped car (The Cadillac). Olivia said that when she looked back at the red sedan everyone was gone, running Westbound. Olivia said that she stuck around with the passengers from the flipped over vehicle (The Cadillac). Olivia stated that the vehicle turning Northbound from Highway 50 was a black Cadillac SUV and that the vehicle that struck it and ended up West of the intersection on Highway 50 was a red Honda Sedan.

Olivia provided me with a signed and written statement.

I then headed to Froedtert South Pleasant Prairie (St. Cats) to speak with other officer's regarding the call. Upon arrival, I headed inside the Hospital and spoke with Genesis. Genesis was reporting pain and swelling in her face, back, shoulder and chest pain, scratches on her legs and right hand, and that she was pregnant. I then photographed Genesis's injuries to the best of my abilities.

I completed DT-4000 from #: 6JL14BTWTS.

On July 20, 2023, I, Officer Vences #686 of Kenosha Police Department, was working in full uniform on third shift in marked squad #3341 (BWC recording). At approximately 2258 hours, I responded to a hit and run injury accident at Green Bay Road and 75th St. Other responding officers advised witnesses saw 4 black male subjects run from the scene towards Kohl's (7200 Green Bay Road). While responding to Kohl's, officers on scene advised there was a black female with a bun (possibly wearing red) holding a baby, and at least one black male.

After clearing the frontage of Kohl's, I cleared the area behind Southport Plaza (plaza of Kohl's) and asked for an update on direction of travel; officers on scene advised witnesses stated the subjects were running westbound beyond the Kohl's plaza.

While checking the area, Applebee's (6950 75th St) staff called and advised a group was seemingly nervous at one of their tables, so I responded there.

Upon entering, an Applebee's employee motioned us to a table on the South wall of the restaurant. The South wall only had one table that was occupied by a black male wearing pants and a shirt with red color, a black female wearing pink pants with a hair bun, and a baby that appeared to be about 1 year old; they appeared to match the description of the subjects who fled the accident.

Officer Courtier #661 and I approached the three subjects and attempted to gather information. The adults were not cooperative with simple questions about their names, so I asked how they got to the restaurant and which car they came in. After asking that question, the couple appeared agitated and did not answer any questions. The male half grabbed the baby and attempted to walk away from us (eastbound) towards the main entrance of the restaurant, but he was stopped by Pleasant Prairie Police; we advised he was detained for the accident investigation.

Once he was stopped, the female half was loud and walked over by Pleasant Prairie Police and Officer Courtier. The male half attempted to walk around the outer perimeter of the restaurant in a clockwise fashion (while still holding the child) , so I told the female half to stay with Officer Courtier (in an attempt to separate the two parties). Considering the rollover accident that occurred, no cooperation from both adults, the male half's unpredictable behavior attempting to walk away from us, and the child's welfare (possible trauma/injuries), I attempted to stop the male half with a modified escort hold to his right arm. The male, while still holding the small child, attempted to swiftly pull away from my grip, so I told him to stop and a struggle ensued; at that time, I was concerned for the baby's safety and did not want the child to fall or get hurt from the male half's decisions possibly forcing us to escalate.

Pleasant Prairie Police assisted me during the struggle, and we were able to get the male half down to a seated position and retrieve the baby from his grasp; during the struggle, the male half continued to attempt to pull away and while doing so, was squeezing the child tighter in his

arm(s). Reference Pleasant Prairie Police Case # 2023-11644 for their information.

After the baby was safely retrieved, I performed a modified "secure the head" decentralization from a half-kneeling stance. The male was successfully decentralized to the ground, and was given several commands to put his hands behind his back. To gain compliance, I delivered multiple strong side hand strikes and strong side forearm strikes to the male half. Due to the dynamics of the situation, the strikes met the subject's head, but they successfully caused him to relax his arms and put those near his back. The subject was arrested for Obstructing/Resisting and placed in the recovery position.

Kenosha Fire Department's medical personnel were summoned to assess the baby and the male half for possible injuries; at that time, the male still refused to cooperate with basic information gathering. While waiting for the ambulance, I put the male in a seated position on the floor and observed a mild odor of OC (oleoresin capsicum) spray in the restaurant, which was mildly irritant. Dispatch was advised that the baby and arrestee could have possibly had secondary OC spray exposure and notified KFD.

KFD rescue staff arrived and the male was assisted to a standing position before being provided a seat at a table to speak with medical personnel. While speaking with KFD rescue, the male was identified as Jermelle L English (verbal ID).

An online records check via Wisconsin Circuit Court Access showed no open cases for Jermelle and dispatch advised he was not under P&P supervision.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE

On 7/21/23, at approximately 2257 HRS, I, PO Price #746, was on duty in full KPD uniform with BWC activated (audio/video) in marked squad 3306. I was assigned to Third Shift Patrol, and was riding dual with PO Maykut #748.

We responded to the 7000 BLK of Green Bay Rd. to block Southbound traffic for officers investigating an Accident with Injuries Call at the intersection of Green Bay Rd and 75th St. (STH 50).

While blocking traffic, officers called an Evidence Technician to the scene of the accident, and I responded.

Upon arrival, PO Riser #782, advised that the accident was a Hit and Run with Injuries, and subjects from a Red Honda Civic (WI AND8394) had fled the scene. PO Riser advised that she manipulated the Honda's keys while she was on scene. I observed that the Honda had extensive damage to the front of the vehicle, and was stopped just West of the intersection at Green Bay Rd., on 75th St., near the median between East and Westbound traffic.

I photographed the interior of the Honda with PO Tripp's #786 camera, and returned the camera back to PO Tripp. I detected a strong odor of Marijuana from within the Honda. I did not observe any red, blood-like substances inside the Honda.

I took Touch/Trace DNA Swabs from the following areas of the interior of the Honda:

- 1 - Driver's Steering Wheel Airbag (Deployed) in the area outlined by a stitched circle.
- 2 - Front Passenger Dashboard Airbag (Deployed) near the center, bottom of the airbag.
- 3 - Interior Driver's Door Handle
- 4 - Interior Front Passenger Door Handle
- 5 - Interior Driver's Rear Passenger Door Handle
- 6 - Interior Passenger Rear Door Handle

Additionally, I observed a blue, 375 mL bottle of Leyenda del Milagro Silver Tequila on the driver's seat. The bottle of tequila was open, and almost empty. I smelled the contents of the bottle, and recognized the smell to be tequila. I photographed the tequila, and then emptied the remaining tequila onto the road, which was captured on BWC.

I observed a brown "No Free Hand Outs" brand sweatshirt with pink writing "No Free Handouts" on the front, located on the front passenger seat. I observed an empty plastic sandwich baggie located in the rear pocket of the front passenger's seat next to an open "Swisher Sweets" Cigarillo pouch. Also located in that same pocket of the seat, I observed a green, "Goodie" brand hair brush
