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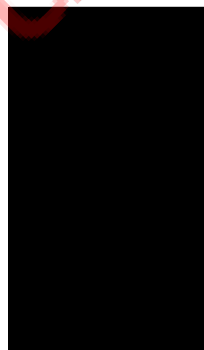

I also received a phone call from Calvin Atkinson, the Field Operations Supervisor for Milwaukee 2-Way, Inc. He indicated that the radio was deliberately disabled. They were able to pull up the radio channel frequency's, but not the serial number of the radio. The reader they have is for a Motorola HT600 which can read the information, but not the serial number. The radio they are checking out has the following frequencies on it.

In speaking to Tess further I asked him about their response to the fire at STH 83 and CTH C and the condition of the vehicle when they were putting out the fire. He indicated that he thought most of the windows were intact, and up on the car. He thinks one was down about 4 inches or so. The fire was in the rear of the car, which was fully engulfed. There was also a deputy on scene. That deputy was Deputy Tim Kreuger 127


We also spoke about the couch fire by Chief Tom Seep's house. He said that Bowman (Mike Bowman) told him that Dexter and Renee spilled lighter fluid on the couch and flipped cigarette butts on the couch to set it on fire.

I also asked him about the call, when they responded to the fire call where dispatch gave them the wrong address. Which way did Dunski respond to that fire. He indicated that when Dunski left the fire department,

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he went left, or East on CTH C. See attached copy of Tess' original statement with written information added and dated 09/08/98.

I spoke to Mike Bogdan in reference to his statement to see if he was able to narrow down the dates of the incidents. Based on the information contained in our investigative reports for the incidents, he was able to agree that those were the incidents. He told me that at the fire located on STH 83 and CTH C, Dexter Moore and Al Dunski Jr. got into a fight with the officer about the windows on the vehicle being broken before or after the fire department arrived. He didn't know the officers name, but said it should be on his fire report or the officers who responded from the Sheriff's Department.

I asked Mike if the date of the couch fire could have been around 12/05/97. He indicated that the couch fire was possibly sometime in October. I also asked him about the indication in his report that there were two 911 calls and one was traced back to bob Greenough Sr. residence. I asked him who traced the calls. He indicated that the information came from Trevor Fire Department Assistant Chief, Edward Kelly. One call was of burning too close to a structure around 02/11/98 and the other was a smoke investigation around 02/17 or 02/18 of 1998. See attached copy of his statement with notes written on it.

On Wednesday 09/09/98 I received a copy of All State Insurance report on their claim number 1213627910 in reference to our case 970125968 dated 10/30/97 at 0312. The victim in that case was Edgar and Diane Schroeder.



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On Wednesday 09/16/98 I received the original information provided by Milwaukee 2-Way, Inc. as sent by Calvin Atkinson. He received the radio from me on 09/02/98 and returned the radio to our department on 09/14/98.

On Thursday 09/17/98 I stopped by Horizon Productions, in Silver Lake, where I spoke to Guy H. Luempert. I showed him the radio that was recovered and he indicated that it looked like one of their's, however without a serial number he was not able to positively identify that radio as being their's. He also looked at the right side of the radio and indicate that something was removed where they would inscribe on a fire department radio SLFD and some would have either a radio number, ie., 10, 12... or if the radio belonged to the rescue squad it would be inscribed with SLRS and a two digit number. He attempted to see if he could get information electronically from the radio, however the radio was defeated by someone. I showed him the information provided by Milwaukee, 2-Way, Inc., and right away he noticed on page three of the information FAXED that the radio A/B tones, which are for the dispatch plectron to set off each radio, for each of the departments paged. The numbers on the list were for Silver Lake Rescue, the numbers were:

It was also noted on the sheet, that Silver Lake Fire Department tones A/B are :

These tones are the tones for Silver Lake Rescue. He could identify the radio as possibly being one of their rescue squad radios, but without the serial number it could not be positively identified, as to who this radio should have been issue to, or belonged to. He was able to provide me with an (800) number in Rockford IL to the Motorola company, who might be able to get a hidden bar code serial number off the electronic board in the radio, however he didn't know for sure if they had any hidden serial numbers for sure.



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On Monday 09/21/98 I met with Kenosha City and County Joint Service's first shift Dispatch Supervisor, Kip Keckler. He was able to provide me with lists of frequency numbers for agencies in Kenosha County. He also found the Two Tone Paging frequencies, which also listed Silver Lake Rescue's A/B tones.

On Tuesday 09/22/98 Special Agent Greg Eggum of DCI, and I met with Dexter Moore at his Probation Officer's Office. Dexter Moore had a scheduled appointment with his PO, so we stopped in, and checked with Dexter Moore to see if he would be willing to speak to us and be interviewed.

At 0820 Dexter Moore came into a conference room, where I identified myself and DCI Agent Greg Eggum. I informed him he was not under arrest and that he could leave at any time he wanted. I also told him of the phone message I received from him on 05/19/98 in which he indicated that he was willing to talk to us, and cooperate with us in any way he can. I confirmed this with him in the presence of his Probation Officer Steve Landerman.

Dexter Moore said that he had called on that date, and that he would cooperate and talk with us. He wanted to get everything cleared up and would cooperate with us in our investigation. At first Dexter was very evasive in answering questions. However once he became more comfortable with us, he said that instead of us going through the question answer, he would just tell us that he was involved in setting fire's in Kenosha County. He said, he usually was just a look out, because he didn't want to get into too much trouble. He also said that he would write down all the fire's he was involved in, and who was with him. See attached list.

While conducting our interview, Dexter asked for a can of Pepsi and also went outside for a cigarette. At 1000 he called his place of employment to let them know he would be late. I told him I would give him a ride to work. He also went out front and told the person who gave him a ride to his appointment with his PO. Steve Landerman. Later I found out that the person was Michael Bowman.

We interviewed Dexter in reference to 98030551 date of incident 03/19/98 at 0525. This incident occurred on the North East corner lot of 232nd Ave. and 120th Street. He indicated that he was riding with Al Dunski Jr. in Dunski's 1997 to 1998 Chevey S-10 Pickup, Green in color. They went from Bob Greenough Jr. house. They went to the Taco Bell, in Antioch IL and when they returned to Dexter Moore's house Dunski saw the Truck and Camper and asked Dexter if anybody lived there.

Dunski, said that it had been a while since they had a fire call so they drove to Dunski's father Al Dunski Sr. who lives in Silver Lake at [REDACTED]



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At the residence, Al went into the house, which was dark, and came out and entered the trunk of a vehicle, described as a Cavalier type vehicle, dark colored. Al removed a paper bag, came back to his truck and put the bag behind the drivers seat. Al then went back into the house and came out. They were there at the house for about 5 to 10 minutes.

They went back to Dexter Moore's house, where Dunski, backed his truck inside Moore's pole barn. Dunski got out of his truck and went to the back bed of the truck, where he produced some latex gloves from an EMT bag. He threw Dexter Moore a pair of gloves, but Moore said, he didn't need any. Dunski also broke the tip off of a flare and then he had a flare about 4 inches long.

Dunski was all siked up, like he just ate a bowl of sugar. Dunski took a flare from the bag and said, he probably shouldn't take all of it. Dexter asked why. Dunski said so it has a chance to burn out before anybody see's it. They crossed the field, East of Moore's house and went by a truck and camper which Moore said, had been sitting there since about 1991 or 1992. The truck was described by Moore, as Blue in color and the camper was White with a Green stripe. The camper was about 20 feet long.

Moore stood by the right passenger side of the truck. He told Dunski, that he would be look out. Dunski entered a broken door on the passenger side of the camper. Dunski was crashing around inside, and Moore told him to be quiet. Dunski said this fuckin place is a mess. Moore heard the sound of a flare tip pop. Moore saw a red glow from the right front window on the trailer. Moore said, Dunski was probably in the trailer for only 1 minute. When Dunski came out they took off.


They got back into Dunski's truck and headed towards Greenough's house. When they got there they jumped on the couch and acted like they were sleeping. One of the Greenough's had a fire pager that went off. They then responded to the fire department. According to Dexter the total time that lapsed from when they set the fire and the tones went off, was about 15 to 20 minutes. I asked Moore why they did this. He said that Dunski wanted to know how long it would take for the fire to start, before someone would see it. He also said he wondered how long it would take the fire department to get there, how large it would get, and how long it would take to put it out.

I also asked Dexter, if he knew what they were going to do before they burned the vehicle. He said that Dunski candied it up. What he meant by candied it up is that Dunski talked it up to where it didn't sound like they were doing anything too bad. It was Dunski who decided to burn the trailer, and Moore said he didn't try to stop

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Dunski from doing this. Moor, said he didn't call the fire department, he don't know who own's the truck or trailer. The owner's didn't ask him to burn their trailer, No one asked them to burn the vehicle or camper. Moore said that no one got hurt and he didn't intend to hurt anyone. He said he was very stupid. See attached statement. See map and diagram attached also.

At 1100 we completed that statement and moved over to the Safety Building where we could be more comfortable. Moore was told he could leave any time he wanted to, take any breaks, smoke, or eat anything. Which he said he under good and wanted to continue to get this all over with.

At 1140 we began another interview into case number 970120073 dated 10/15/97 at 0232. This incident occurred at the Spring Valley Country Club at 23913 Wilmot Rd. In speaking to Moore, he indicated that this vehicle is the very first vehicle they burned. He described the vehicle as a Ford LTD station wagon with Brown wood sides. The vehicle was for sale.

Moore said that he was with Al Dunski Jr. and Renee Thuemmler who drove them in her White Mustang. They were coming from Classic Billiards which is located in Kenosha on 22nd Ave., and 75th Street. A couple of days before they burned the station wagon. Moore said that, Dunski and Moore were in Dunski's truck and saw the vehicle for sale. Dunski said, that it was a while since they have had a car fire. Then the night they burned the vehicle, Dunski told Moore that tonight we're going to get that car.



Renee dropped them off at a bar called Extra Innings. Extra Innings, is also known as Furlan's Dugout to some people. Renee needed to get some cigarettes so she drove off towards Antioch. Moore and Dunski pretended to go towards the tavern, but instead stopped on the South side of the building where Dunski pulled out a spark plug, and a 4" red flare. Moore took the spark plug and broke the porcelain off it.

They ran across STH 83 towards the East, then ran North along the ditch line of the cemetery to Spring Valley Country Club. There parked and for sale was a Ford LTD station wagon with wood sides. Moore ran towards the right front passenger door and threw a handful of porcelain at the window, which immediately spidered. Moore started running back towards Extra Innings, and could hear Dunski clearing out glass, which dropped on the front seat. Moore heard 2 to 3 strikes of the tip of a flare. They ran back towards Extra Innings. When he saw Dunski running back, Dunski said that sucker is going. As they ran across the road, Renee was coming back from the South to pick them up.

Renee drove them South on STH 83 back to Moore's house. As they entered the driveway, they heard Trevor Fire being dispatched to a fire over a radio that Dunski had with him. I asked Moore to describe the radio to me. He said it was a Motorola 6 channel radio. Moore said the radio Dunski had is from the Silver Lake Fire Department. I asked Moore, if Dunski ever said when he got the radio, and all Moore knew was that Dunski said he got the radio the night of the Silver Lake fire. I asked if he said, anything about if it was before the fire, during the fire, or while fighting the fire, and he said that Dunski never said for sure, other than he got the radio from the Silver Lake Fire Department. I asked Moore to describe any markings, or identifying characteristics on the radio. He said it has red tape on the right side. I used my department radio to have him describe where the tape was. He indicated the radio had Red tape around the top of the antenna and he wasn't sure, but Red tape either on the right side or around the body of the radio. I asked Moore if he could identify the radio again if he ever saw it again, and he could.



At the Trevor Fire Department, they responded in squad 6411. Neal Fisher, Chuck Tess, Dunski, and Moore responded in the squad. Moore indicated that he fought the fire from the right passenger side. The only windows in tact, was the windshield and the right rear side window of the station wagon.

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Moore indicated that while at the scene of the fire, he got into an argument with Deputy Tim Krueger 127. The argument was about the windows being broken. Deputy Krueger wanted to know who broke the windows and why. Moore said, the fire breaks the windows. Deputy Krueger said, how do I know you didn't do it with the nozzle? Moore said, how do I know you didn't do it with your flash light? Right then, a Dunkin Doughnut's truck was going by, and Chuck Tess told him, There goes your back up! and everyone started laughing. Chief Seep, told them to quit messing with the cop.

Moore said, that Dunski started crawling through the car, like he was doing his own investigation. Dunski told Krueger and a new deputy, that the fire started in the back of the station wagon. When they were fighting the fire, Dunski forced open some of the doors, but Moore didn't know which ones.

Moore said, he never told anyone about the fires, or that they had done them. A couple of days after this fire, Dunski and Moore were talking, and Dunski said it was weird, how it burned the back seat, and that it was still in tack. Dunski said that he threw the flare in the back seat. Moore didn't know how the fire started, but the vehicle was gutted. They never discussed the fire with Renee.

Moore said he didn't know the owner(s), they didn't ask him to set the 1989 Ford LTD, Station Wagon on fire. No one else asked them to except Dunski. Moore said he did the fire with Dunski, because they wanted to know how it burned, how it started, see it burn, and got to go to the fire in the fire truck. I asked if getting to go to the fire in the fire truck did anything for him, like hearing the siren or seeing the lights. All he said was no nothing like that, it was just being able to go to the fire. See attached statement. This interview and statement ended at 1325.


We took a break and Moore smoked a cigarette out side. Moore indicated that he would like to go to work soon, so I asked if we could just talk about the rest and take a written statement from him later. He said that would be fine.

We continued with the interview. I asked him about the Silver Lake Fire Department Fire. 970101526 dated 09/01/97 at 0342. Moore said that when Trevor Fire Department responded to the fire, and arrived at Silver Lake Fire Department, there was a train going through that blocked their way for a while.

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There was quite a few people already on scene. He indicated that Al Dunski was waiving them to the West side of the fire department. Also there was Silver Lake Fire Chief, Chief Tanski and assistant Chief Zimmer and a long haired guy, who drives an old white cop motorcycle was already there along with a couple of more people, he didn't know.

Dunski was trying to direct the trucks. I asked Moore how long he has known Dunski. He said that prior to the Silver Lake Fire, he had only seen Dunski once or twice. He never actually knew Dunski.

The day of the Silver Lake Fire Department fire, Dunski had a radio, but the radio he had didn't have any red tape on it. I asked him if he ever asked Dunski where he got the radio with the red tape on it, and Dunski told him that he got it the night of the Silver Lake Fire, from the Fire Department. That radio was always with Dunski since the first time Moore met Dunski, which was about one month before Dunski joined Trevor fire.

I stopped the interview and went and got the radio I recovered from Bob Greenough Sr. When I showed Moore the radio he loudly said that's the radio, how did you get it. We didn't talk about that, but continued with Moore telling me, that Moore is the one who disabled the radio.

Moore said that Dunski had taken a crystal out of Moore's fire department pager and when Moore found out that his pager wasn't working, he confronted Dunski about it, and Dunski told Moore, that he took the crystal.


Knowing Dunski took Moore's pager crystal. Dunski had left the radio at Greenough's house and Moore found it, and disabled the radio, by taking out and throwing away a couple of screws. He said, that he also took out what he called a brain chip and diaphragm that folds out of the radio. Moore said he ripped it out and threw them into the garbage.

We also spoke about the Cadi/Lincoln fire. He indicated that it took 4 times to get that vehicle going on fire. First Dunski used only a flare but it went out. They returned with lighter fluid and that didn't work. They returned a third time with gasoline and it went out again. Then the last time they returned with lighter fluid and gas, and left the door ajar so air would get in, and it finally got going.

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The last thing we talked about was a couch that Moore and someone named Jamie Waters set on fire near Trevor Fire Chief Tom Seep's house. He said that Waters soaked the couch with lighter fluid and Moore flicked cigarette's at the couch until it started on fire. I asked why they did this and Moore said that Jamie was mad at the home owner for something.

We ended the interview at 1400. I took Moore to work in Libertyville. On the way, we stopped at the McDonald's on STH 50, just West of I 94 and I bought Moore something to eat. Enroute to Moore's work Moore made a comment that Dunski had once told him that, the less people involved in setting the fire's, the less chance of getting in trouble.

On the way back to Kenosha I stopped by Trevor Fire Department and Chief Seep provided me with a copy of their fire call list from 01/04/97 to 12/29/97. See attached. I went over with it to see what was the date of the couch fire, and it was 10/04/97 at 0109. I will be checking to see if there is a Kenosha Sheriff's Department case number for that call and putting it in a follow up report.



I spoke to Bowman in regards to him talking to people and telling them that Moore and Dunski have been setting fires. I asked him if he had first hand information to this from either of the suspects and he didn't. Everything he knew about was only rumor he had heard. I asked him specifically about him making a statement about the fire at CTH C and STH 83 in which it was alleged that Bowman had told another fire fighter that "do you remember the fire at C & 83, well Moore and Dunski Jr. set the car on fire." He said that he may have said

something to the Assistant Chief Ed Kelly. I also asked him if he had ever said anything about Dexter Moore setting a couch on fire by Seep's house, and he said that he didn't. I asked him who he had heard the rumor from, and he said that Bob Greenough Sr. had told him that.

I asked Bowman how long he was with Trevor Fire Department, and he indicated that he has been there for about 5 years. He also told me about an incident in January or February of this year, where Dunski Jr., took a crystal out of Moore's pager for the fire department. Moore got mad and Dunski had this hand held radio that Bowman described as having Red tape on the right side of the radio. Dunski Jr. told Bowman that Dunski bought it from RC Electronics for a couple hundred dollars used. Well, Moore took the radio apart so it wouldn't work, because of what Dunski did to Moore's pager.

I asked him if he remembers a fire they responded to back in March in the area of Moore's house where a camper and truck were set on fire. He did, he said that same night he was at Classic Billiards located in Kenosha on 22nd Ave., and 75th Street. He had gone there with Bob Greenough Jr., Don McCoy. Dexter Moore and Al Dunski were there too, but they had gone in Dunski's truck. They all were there from approximately 2000 to 2330. When they left, Dunski and Moore left in his truck, and the other guys left in their vehicle. They all stopped by I 94 and STH 50 to get something to eat. They went to Taco Bell, while Dunski and Moore stopped at the Taco Bell. They all then went over to Bob Greenough Sr's., house.

I asked who responded to the fire in what vehicles. He wasn't sure, but Dennis went with Bob Jr. and Bob Sr. in their vehicle, he wasn't sure who Moore went with, but Dunski took his truck.

I asked Bowman if he was aware of or had any direct knowledge of any fire fighters in Kenosha County setting fires. He said no and that he would help in any way he could to get anyone who is doing anything like that. I asked him what if anything Dexter Moore said to him after leaving Probation and Parole Tuesday. All Moore told him was that he had a lot to do there, and that because he was at the Silver Lake Fire, we wanted to talk to him about the Silver Lake Fire Department fire. I gave Bowman a card to contact me if he hears anything more in reference to any of the fire's or fire fighters setting fire's in Kenosha County.

I went to [REDACTED] the residence of Renee A. Thuemmler. There was a White Mustang with Wisconsin registration TMW354 sitting in the driveway. I ran the plate, and it came back to Renee A. Thuemmler on a 1988 Ford Mustang, VIN: 1FABP41A2JF136072.

I went to the residence and knocked on the door and rang the bell, however no one would answer or respond. See attached TTY.



I introduced myself and Special Agent Greg Eggum to Allen M. Dunski and told him that I had talked to him in the past in reference to fire investigations that I was conducting. I also said in the presence of his PO Steve Landerman, that Dunski could leave at any time he wanted, and that Dunski had said to me in the past that he was willing to cooperate and talk to me. At that point Dunski said he was willing to talk to us now. I asked PO Landerman if there was anything he needed to talk to Dunski about at this time. Landerman asked him about some updated information in regards to his probation. Landerman then left.

I asked Dunski if he knew why we were there to talk to him. He immediately said I know what you want to talk to me about. Chief Tanski from the Silver Lake Fire Department has accused me of setting the fire to the Silver Lake Fire Department. "If that is what this is about, I want a lawyer". I immediately said no, we want to talk to you in reference to Trevor Fire Department and several fires.

Dunski, said that if that is what we wanted to talk to him about, he was willing to talk to us, and that he didn't have a lot of time, because his brother in-law, Dennis Lichter was outside waiting for him, and that he had only a half hour, or until about 6 P.M. I told him that if he needed a ride and Lichter had to go, I would give him a ride anywhere he wanted including, work in IL. Dunski said no, he wanted to go with his brother in-law, because he had Dunski's truck.



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He answered identifying information and I then, asked Special Agent Greg Eggum for a bag I had sitting inside a box. The bag contained flare material and debris. We just sat there, Dunski looked at it, and said, "What's that". I told him, you tell me. He then said that is a flare.

We told him, that we know of his involvement in the setting of some, minor fires and that now is the opportunity for him to clear these matters up with us. They are very minor and we know that you want to get this cleared up. His response was, other people were spreading rumors about me setting fires. Our response to him was, these aren't rumors and you know it. They are true and you have the chance to clear it up. We need to hear your side of the story.

Dunski then went on to say "I may need a lawyer". Special Agent Eggum, then told him "fine, that's it, good bye, there's the door". I got up and, said just a second, I'll go get his PO, because he has to let him out.

Later Eggum told me, that when I left the room. Eggum didn't say anything more until Dunski said, "people have spread rumors about me, and I'm not responsible for them." Eggum told Dunski, your at a cross road, and it's up to you which fork you take. You have an opportunity to give your side of the story. If you don't want to talk to us any more, we'll see you in court, we're not dealing in rumors. Dunski responded, what I really want to do is talk with my dad, not a lawyer. Eggum told me, he responded by stating "in other words, you don't want a lawyer, what you want, is to talk to your dad". Eggum said that Dunski said yes. That is when I came back with Dunski's PO.


When I went and got PO Landerman, I told him he is going to probably have to let Dunski leave if there is nothing more he needs to do with Dunski. Dunski may be evoking his right to a lawyer right now with Agent Eggum. Eggum who was still in there with Dunski.

When I got back into the room, I said to Landerman, Dunski wants to leave and asked him to go ahead and let him leave. When they left the room. Eggum told me, he wasn't so sure Dunski wanted a lawyer. Dunski just had said, "He may need a lawyer, but never asked for a lawyer. Dunski, told Eggum, that what he wanted was to talk to his dad now, and not a lawyer. I quick said, let me check this out to see if that's what he want's and see if I can salvage this. I confronted Dunski and his PO and asked them to come back to see if what Eggum told me is true, and I asked Dunski straight out. Is it true what Agent Eggum just told me, that you don't want to talk to a lawyer, but that you do want to talk with your dad.

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Dunski replied, yes I just want to talk to my dad. I told Dunski, he's an adult, he can't just always call daddy to fix this, it is only him who can straighten this whole thing up, by telling the truth. In front of Dunski's PO I asked him straight out, do you want a lawyer, yes or no. Dunski said NO. I asked Dunski will you talk to us now, yes or no. Dunski said yes.

After PO Landerman left the room, Dunski made the following statement. Dunski said that there was a station wagon at STH 83 and CTH C. He, Dexter Moore, and a girl named Renee and an unknown male were in Renee's White Mustang. Dexter Moore told Dunski there is a car, it's been a while since we had a fire, let's set the car on fire, so we got a car fire. (Refer to case number 970120073 dated 10/15/97 at 0239).



We drove to Trevor Fire Department and Dexter got a torch. The torch didn't work, so Dexter got a flare. He also pulled out a spark plug, broke the porcelain and used it to break out the station wagon's back right side passenger door window.

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Dunski said that they were dropped off at an unknown house. Dexter broke the window on the station wagon, and Dunski took the flare to burn the car, but Dunski chickened out and they left in Renee's car to this house.

But then they went back to the station wagon. Dunski said they ran back to the station wagon and Moore, lit it on fire. They all left and went back to Trevor in Renee's car. Dunski said he didn't try to stop Moore, no one else was involved. Dunski didn't know who's car they set on fire. When I asked him why, Dunski said, he didn't know, he was just plain stupid.

The next fire Dunski told us about was a camper near Dexter Moore's house. (Refer to case number 98030551 dated 03/19/98 at 0528). Moore and Dunski were staying by Bob Greenough's house. Bob is a Trevor Fire Department member. Dexter wanted to go find something to start on fire. Dunski was driving his truck. They went to Moore's shed or pole barn, what ever it is called. Dexter took something to burn, Dunski also said something about a spark plug but didn't continue on about the plug.

Moore and Dunski went to the camper across the street from Moore's house. They both went inside the camper. Dunski said it was a real mess. Dunski said he saw a car. So they both got out. Dunski said that, Moore always wants Dunski to light the fire's, but Dunski didn't want to. Dunski, said I know I was there, and it's just like doing the fire. We were inside the camper for about 5 minutes. Moore lit the fire and we took off to Greenough's house. Dunski said they did it because they were board and wanted to burn it.

The next fire Dunski said he was involved with, Dunski was with Moore, a Natalie Bundza of Paris Fire Department, and Dennis Bowman. They were driving around in Natalie Bundza's care a Blue, either Renault or Dodge Aries 4 door.

They drove around and noticed a car on the side of the road, he wasn't sure of the exact location, so I asked him to draw a map. He indicated it was in a subdivision near Moore's house. See attached map, dated 09/30/98 1813 with D117 by Dunski. (Refer to case number 970125968 dated 10/30/97 at 0312).

Dunski said that, Moore and Bundza said they were going to burn it. At Moore's house Dennis Bowman, left and went home. Moore, Bundza, and Dunski got into Bundza's vehicle and went by the car. They parked her car and Moore broke out the window on the car. Natalie lit it on fire, and Dunski looked out for them from about 6 to 7 feet away from them.


Then Dunski said, on the first try, Moore couldn't break the window, so they ran back to Moore's house. Then they returned and Dunski found out the car was open or something, but they got in. They lit the car on fire, and left for Moore's house. They had used a fuse. They waited for a fire call. None came.

Dunski said something about a Tandem bike, but he wasn't sure and continued on with them going back to the car a third time, and finding out it didn't light. Moore opened the door and the car was filled with smoke. Moore used something like a lighter to get the car going on fire.

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Then they left and got the fire call. Dunski said he don't know the owner, He guesses he was with the wrong people. He had the wrong idea's and he didn't know the reason why they set the fires. Dunski said he wanted the fire to burn. Dunski also said that everyone has been spreading rumors about him setting the fires, and we said what their saying is true then is true isn't it. Dunski said yes.

Dunski stated they responded with Trevor Fire Department to all of these fire's. Dunski refused to give a written statement at this time, however he said, he would write it out and get it to me. Dunski was confronted with the discrepancies in his statement. He said that he didn't have anymore time to go over the statement(s) and Dunski wanted to leave. The interview was ended, and he was allowed to leave. The time was 1813. See attached diagram by Al Dunski Jr.

On Thursday 10/01/98 DCI Agent Greg Eggum and I attempted to make contact with Natalie M. Bundza at her residence. The vehicle described by Al Dunski as being a Blue either a Renault or Dodge Arries 4 Door appeared to be sitting in the driveway. The vehicle had a WI registration of PEY 223.



She came with her mother Nancy. When I came out to get her, I told her that I wanted to talk to her in reference to an investigation in reference to Trevor Fire Department and several fires being set by Fire Fighters. I asked her mom to wait for her, that when we were through Natalie would come out to her. Natalie came back to the interview room where she was informed that she wasn't under arrest and that she could leave at any time she wanted. I asked her if she was willing to talk to us and she was.

She said that she would give us a statement and help us in our investigation, but was concerned on how long it would take, as her mother had to go pick up Natalie's grandmother. I told her, that if we were going to be late I would give her a ride home, and her mother could leave. Since her mother already knew what was going on I brought her in and told her that Natalie was cooperating and was concerned about her having to leave. I asked if it was OK, that she (Mrs. Bundza) could leave. We would be taking Natalie's statement and in stead of her coming back to pick Natalie up, Agent Eggum and I would just give Natalie a ride home, which we later did. Mrs. Bundza did leave and I took a statement from Natalie.

Natalie said that on 10/29/97 around 5 P.M. she drove to the Trevor Fire Department in her mother's Blue, Plymouth Reliant. Al Dunski and Dexter Moore were there.

Later they got into a conversation about being able to break car windows with porcelain and left to got to Moore's house. In Moore's garage, Dexter got a couple of old spark plugs, put them into a rag and smashed them with a hammer.


Moore wanted to show her how it worked, but didn't want to break any windows on either of their car's, so Dexter Moore, Al Dunski, and Natalie Bundza left in Bundza's mothers car. Dexter was in the right front passenger seat and Al was in the back seat, sitting behind Dexter. As they drove by car's Moore and Dunski would throw the broken porcelain at parked cars on the side of the road. Natalie remembers at least hearing one car's window shatter. She didn't remember what the car looked like, but said she could drive by it at a later date.

They returned to Trevor Fire Department around 9 P.M. Dexter and Al talked about getting a flare and throwing it into a car. She didn't remember for sure who decided between the two, but they decided to go do it.

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Al had a flare, that was about 5 inches long. They got into Bundza's car and drove around. They wanted to throw the flare into a car, off the main roads where no one would see them.

They found a powder Blue car, near Mike Bogdan's. Natalie parked down the road about 50 yards away, while Al and Dexter got out of the car. Dexter had some porcelain, and Al had a flare. Natalie was scared to death and wondered what she was doing there.

Al came running back with Dexter running behind him and said go, so she drove back to Moore's house. On the way, they were all ditty and scared. When they got to the house Bundza told them she can't believe they did that, and that it wasn't a good idea. They were sitting there and she was freaking and crying. None of their pagers went off. Dexter said that they have to finish it, the car didn't start on fire. Al said, yeah, we gota finish this, they'll know it was arson.

They returned a second time. They took bikes. Dexter and Natalie took a tandem bike, and Al took a single bike. When they got back to the car, Natalie stood by the back end of the passenger side of the car. The windows were all gray from smoke. They were afraid to open the car door. Dexter looked inside through the right rear passenger door, and saw the back seat had a hole burned in it on the right side. (See map and diagram attached). They all left and went back to Dexter's house.

Dexter and Al both said they have to finish this. They were deciding who would do what. Dexter was all worried that it was close to his house, and that Tom Seep was going to kick his ass. They had also touched the car and their finger prints were on the car.


They all returned a third time. This time Dexter handed Natalie a can of charcoal lighter fluid. Natalie said they should just fuckin, forget about it, and that it was stupid. But they were afraid of getting caught without finishing it.

They all approached the car. They argued about who was going to do what. Natalie was about to give them the lighter fluid, when they told her, no you do it. She said fuck this, you do it, I'm not getting involved and walked away from them giving Dexter the lighter fluid.

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Al had a lighter and got some papers out of the car. They had the right rear door open and Dexter squirted lighter fluid into the car and Al, lit the paper and threw it into the car. They all took off running, but stopped by the bikes. It didn't start.

Dexter, now went back a fourth time, by himself while she waited with Al. This time the car went up into flames. They took off for Dexter's house, and when they got there the pagers went off. In all, Natalie thinks they started trying to set the car on fire, from midnight until about 2 minutes before the pagers went off.

Natalie said, they don't know the owner. She didn't try to stop them, because she was afraid that they would slander her with the fire departments. Al made a joke about this, saying you were real scared weren't you. We'll go down for this. When Dexter and Al left for the fire call they left in Al's Jeep. After this Natalie said she wouldn't talk to Al or Dexter. See statement.

In speaking to Natalie, we asked if she would consent to having a conversation between her and Dexter Moore taped, both audio and visual. Natalie said that she would consent to that and help in anyway she can, because of how bad she feels about this whole incident and now that she has it in the open she wants to make thing right.

A surveillance was conducted with the assistance of DCI. See their reports for details.

On Saturday 10/03/98 Dexter Moore was taken into custody for Arson. Upon his arrest I told him not to say anything. I also told him that I would be talking to him later at the safety building and that an officer was going to take him to the safety building in a marked squad car.

At the Public Safety Building, I read Dexter Moore his Miranda Rights to which he waived them. See attached signed waiver. I reinterviewed him in reference to the fire at 22813 116th St. Trevor, WI. KSD 970125968 he said that he had lied to us in his earlier statements. He was trying to protect the other fire fighters. He said that Al Dunski Jr., Natalie Bundza the girl that was with him today when I arrested him was also with them.

He said this fire took place in the early morning. Al Dunski and Dexter tried to break the window out of a light Blue Lincoln. Natalie was only the look out. Dunski and Moore were using rocks to try to break the window. The window wouldn't break, and Dunski found the door opened. Dunski had a flare and threw it into the car and they took off.

They returned a second time and the car was filled with smoke. Al said that they have to do it now. Dexter was looking in the right rear passenger door and saw the back right passenger seat bottom had a hold burned in it.

They all returned on bikes to Dexter's house where Al got some Charcoal lighter fluid. They went back to the vehicle a third time and Al doused the car with the fluid, Dexter gave Al, Dexter's lighter and Al lite the car on fire. They left the door open and the car took off.

They went back to Dexter's house and their pagers went off, and Al and Dexter responded to the fire station to fight the fire. Dexter don't know the owner of the vehicle. The owner didn't ask them to set the car on fire and Dexter didn't try to stop Al from setting the car on fire.

I asked Dexter if he ever told anyone about setting these fires. He said that he told Chuck Tess at one of their meetings. He also said something to Mike Bogdan about some of the fire's but couldn't remember which ones he told Bogdan or Tess about.



Dexter said that Renee Thuemmler knew what they were going to set the fire, she dropped Dexter Moore, Al Dunski Jr., and a Jamie Waters off. Before the fire they were all at a pool hall in Kenosha earlier in the evening. He don't know why they burned the vehicle, except it was for fun and because they like to go on fire calls. It was Al Dunski's idea to burn the car. He said that everything that was said in his original statement was true, except that Renee did know what they were doing, and that Jamie Waters was with them, but he didn't say what Jamie was doing with them, or why he would have involved another fire fighter.



Dexter went on to say that Jamie waters is the one who set the couch on fire and Dexter was with him when Jamie did it. Dexter said he didn't know why they did the couch fire, except that he thought that Jamie was mad at the people who put the couch out in front of their house. I had found the couch fire was on 10/04/97 according to the information provided to me by Trevor Fire Chief Tom Seep. The location of that fire was 11341 270th Ave. Trevor, WI.

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I confronted Dexter about his statement on the Camper/Truck fire. (Case 98030551 dated 03/19/98 at 0525). The Camper and Truck was located right by his house. Dexter said that he was inside the camper with Al Dunski Jr. The place was a mess, but he didn't say if they made it a mess, or if it was a mess before they got in there. He said that Al Dunski told him that he had teepee'd the cushions and set them on fire with a flare. Moore didn't see Dunski light the cushions, because when Dunski started to light the flare, Dexter took off running out of the camper. When they went into the camper, Dunski had a flare with him. Dexter did say that the camper was an old camper.

There was no written statement taken at this time. Dexter Moore was also interview about another matter which will be documented in 970101526. Dexter through out the interview was allowed to get drinks of water, go to the bathroom, and smoke cigarettes.

I told Dexter that he is going to be charged with three counts of Arson of Property Other Than Building: Violation of SS 943.03, and that I would be getting a hold of his PO to place a hold on him. Dexter was taken up to the Jail where he was booked. I did contact Probation and Parole and had a PO Hold placed on Dexter Moore and Al Dunski Jr., for violating their parole by having contact with one another when the courts had ordered them to not have contact with each other. The violation occurred on 03/19/98 when they set fire to the camper/truck which was located on the N/E corner of 232nd Ave., and 120th St. This location is directly across the street from Dexter Moore's house. 

We talked about 970120073 dated 10/15/97 at 0232. Spring Valley Golf Course. Renee wasn't sure of the date, but said that she had drove Dexter Moore and Al Dunski to the Dug Out. I asked her if that was Al Dunski Jr., or Al Dunski Sr. She only knew him to be about her age, and she didn't know if he was a Jr. or Sr. The Dug Out is a tavern located on STH 83 just South of CTH C.

Renee said she just dropped them off at the tavern and left to go to Antioch, IL. to get some cigarettes. She went to a service station she called Bernies.

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When they were driving home, Renee said they went by the intersection of STH 83 and CTH C. As they drove by the Golf Course where the car was still sitting. They told Renee, that is where they had their fire call. Renee, said, Oh! isn't that odd. Dexter then told her they had started it. I asked her what she understood started it to mean, and she said they started the car on fire. But that isn't the way they said it, they just said started it.

Renee said that she told them it put her into a predicament and they told her that all she did is just drive and not to worry about it, she wasn't involved. After that she dropped Moore and Dunski at Moore's house. See her statement. After wards I confronted her about her statement and that it conflicted with the statement we already had of her involvement in the fires. I also asked her if anyone else was involved with them. She hesitated, and then she said no, that was it, and she wasn't hiding anything.

I asked her if there was any reason that Dexter Moore would tell us a lie about her involvement in any of the fires, and that others may have been involved in that fire with her, and she said no. I asked her if Al Dunski would lie about her, and she said, she didn't know. I asked her if she had spoken to Dexter Moore, prior to giving this statement. Renee said that she had met with him on Friday night, 10/02/98. I asked her if he told her what to say or what he said about her involvement in the fires. Renee said no. I asked her before she left if there was anything she wanted to straighten up or change in her written statement and she said no. While she was sitting out front waiting for us to talk to her, Jamie Waters had come into the PSB to see me, so he knows she was in talking to us. I asked her if I could talk to her at a later date some more about what occurred and she said I could leave a message for her and she would meet with me.





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Dieter and Moore were trying to figure out how to lite the couch on fire. This was around midnight. Moore said that they could use a lighter. Moore was discussing this with them all trying to figure out who was going to do it. Waters said it wasn't going to be him. They were at Waters house and got into Thimler's car and drove to the end of their road.

Waters said that Dieter walked over to the couch from Thimler's car and lit the couch on fire and came running back to the car. Waters said that about, One or two hours earlier that night, Waters and Moore kept flicking cigarettes on the couch trying to get it to burn, but it didn't.

After setting the couch on fire, they drove over to the Amocco and Moore called the fire in on a 911 call, and used Dieters real name. When the call came in Moore went on the fire call with Trevor Fire Chief Tom Seep on the grass rig. See statement.

I checked with dispatch and the couch fire was called in as a 911 call from Trevor Mini-Mart. The call came in 10/04/97 at 01:06:15 from 862 9911. See attached 911 records for the call. Case 970115418. All the 911 information was located by Communications Manager Dolly Brennan.



At Trevor Fire Department, Al Dunski told them about porcelain being used to break windows without being loud. The porcelain when used will just crack the window. Dunski and Moore looked around the station for a spark plug and found one. They took the spark plug and broke the porcelain into small pieces by wrapping the spark plug in a rag and taking a crescent wrench and hitting the spark plug and breaking the porcelain off.

Dunski then went into the grass rig and got a flare, which he cut down to about 2 inches long. Dunski said that the flare would burn up before anyone gets to the fire.

They all sat around the fire house a while and Dunski and Moore talked about burning the car that was for sale on STH 83 and CTH C. They all got into Thimler's car and drove to the Dug Out Tavern which is located South of where the car was parked, for sale.

Moore told Thimler to go around the block, while Moore, Dunski, and Waters ran across the street East to the ditch line, where they ran North to the Golf Course. A car was coming on CTH C going West approaching STH 83, so they waited behind a building. After it was clear, Waters stayed by the building watching, while Moore and Dunski ran up to the Station Wagon that was for sale.


They went to the Driver's side of the station wagon. Dunski broke out the driver's side back passenger door window with the porcelain. Then Moore handed Dunski the flare, Moore had and Dunski threw it through the driver's side back passenger door window and they all ran.

Thimler picked them up and then a short while later the Fire Department tones went off and they took Dunski and Moore to the Trevor Fire Department where they responded to the call. Thimler and Waters stayed at the fire station while Moore and Dunski responded with Trevor Fire Department to put the fire out.

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Waters said that they didn't tell anyone at the fire station what they did. They didn't know who owned the car, but they knew that they were going to burn the car when they left the fire station to burn the car. Waters didn't try to stop them and doesn't remember ever telling anyone but us about the fire. He said he quit hanging with Moore, Dunski, and Thimler since then. Thimler is being typed as he thought her name was spelled. Renee's real name is Renee A. Thuemmler. See statement.

Afterwards I asked Waters why he never tried to stop them and why they set the fires. All he said, was he wasn't sure why he didn't try to stop them or even got involved with them. He said they (Moore and Dunski) just wanted to go to fire calls. During the interview Waters made three diagrams. See attached. I had Waters printed and released. See attached Non-Custodial Booking.





I asked Mike if the date of the couch fire could have been around 12/05/97. He indicated that the couch fire was possibly sometime in October. I also asked him about the indication in his report that there were two 911 calls and one was traced back to bob Greenough Sr. residence. I asked him who traced the calls. He indicated that the information came from Trevor Fire Department Assistant Chief, Edward Kelly. One call was of burning too close to a structure around 02/11/98 and the other was a smoke investigation around 02/17 or 02/18 of 1998. See attached copy of his statement with notes written on it.

He attempted to see if he could get information electronically from the radio, however the radio was defeated by someone. I showed him the information provided by Milwaukee, 2-Way, Inc., and right away he noticed on page three of the information FAXED that the radio A/B tones, which are for the dispatch plectron to set off each radio, for each of the departments paged. The numbers on the list were for Silver Lake Rescue, the numbers were:

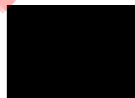

On Monday 09/21/98 I met with Kenosha City and County Joint Service's first shift Dispatch Supervisor, Kip Keckler. He was able to provide me with lists of frequency numbers for agencies in Kenosha County. He also found the Two Tone Paging frequencies, which also listed Silver Lake Rescue's A/B tones.

On Tuesday 09/22/98 Special Agent Greg Eggum of DCI, and I met with Dexter Moore at his Probation Officer's Office. Dexter Moore had a scheduled appointment with his PO, so we stopped in, and checked with Dexter Moore, to see if he would be willing to speak to us and be interviewed.

At 0820 Dexter Moore came into a conference room, where I identified myself and DCI Agent Greg Eggum. I informed him he was not under arrest and that he could leave at any time he wanted. I also told him of the phone message I received from him on 05/19/98 in which he indicated that he was willing to talk to us, and cooperate with us in any way he can. I confirmed this with him in the presence of his Probation Officer Steve Landerman.

Dexter Moore said that he had called on that date, and that he would cooperate and talk with us. He wanted to get everything cleared up and would cooperate with us in our investigation. However once he became more comfortable with us, he said that instead of us going through the question answer, he would just tell us that he was involved in setting fire's in Kenosha County. He said, he usually was just a look out, because he didn't want to get into too much trouble. He also said that he would write down all the fire's he was involved in, and who was with him. We interviewed Dexter in reference to 98030551 date of incident 03/19/98 at 0525. This incident occurred on the North East corner lot of 232nd Ave. and 120th Street. He indicated that he was riding with Al Dunski Jr. in Dunski's 1997 to 1998 Chevy S-10 Pickup, Green in color. They went from Bob Greenough Jr. house. They went to the Taco Bell, in Antioch IL and when they returned to Dexter Moore's house Dunski saw the Truck and Camper and asked Dexter if anybody lived there.

Dunski, said that it had been a while since they had a fire call so they drove to Dunski's father Al Dunski Sr. who lives in Silver Lake at 421 West Chestnut St.

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At the residence, Al went into the house, which was dark, and came out and entered the trunk of a vehicle, described as a Cavalier type vehicle, dark colored. Al removed a paper bag, came back to his truck and put the bag behind the drivers seat. Al then went back into the house and came out. They were there at the house for about 5 to 10 minutes.

They went back to Dexter Moore's house, where Dunski, backed his truck inside Moore's pole barn. Dunski got out of his truck and went to the back bed of the truck, where he produced some latex gloves from an EMT bag. He threw Dexter Moore a pair of gloves, but Moore said, he didn't need any. Dunski also broke the tip off of a flare and then he had a flare about 4 inches long.

Dunski was all siked up, like he just ate a bowl of sugar. Dunski took a flare from the bag and said, he probably shouldn't take all of it. Dexter asked why. Dunski said so it has a chance to burn out before anybody see's it. They crossed the field, East of Moore's house and went by a truck and camper which Moore said, had been sitting there since about 1991 or 1992. The truck was described by Moore, as Blue in color and the camper was White with a Green stripe. The camper was about 20 feet long.

Moore stood by the right passenger side of the truck. He told Dunski, that he would be look out. Dunski entered a broken door on the passenger side of the camper. Dunski was crashing around inside, and Moore told him to be quiet. Dunski said this fuckin place is a mess. Moore heard the sound of a flare tip pop. Moore saw a red glow from the right front window on the trailer. Moore said, Dunski was probably in the trailer for only 1 minute. When Dunski came out they took off.

They got back into Dunski's truck and headed towards Greenough's house. When they got there they jumped on the couch and acted like they were sleeping. One of the Greenough's had a fire pager that went off. They then responded to the fire department. According to Dexter the total time that lapsed from when they set the fire and the tones went off, was about 15 to 20 minutes. I asked Moore why they did this. He said that Dunski wanted to know how long it would take for the fire to start, before someone would see it. He also said he wondered how long it would take the fire department to get there, how large it would get, and how long it would take to put it out.

I also asked Dexter, if he knew what they were going to do before they burned the vehicle. He said that Dunski candied it up. What he meant by candied it up is that Dunski talked it up to where it didn't sound like they were doing anything too bad. It was Dunski who decided to burn the trailer, and Moore said he didn't try to stop

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Dunski from doing this. Moor, said he didn't call the fire department, he don't know who own's the truck or trailer. The owner's didn't ask him to burn their trailer, No one asked them to burn the vehicle or camper. Moore said that no one got hurt and he didn't intend to hurt anyone. He said he was very stupid. See attached statement. See map and diagram attached also.

At 1100 we completed that statement and moved over to the Safety Building where we could be more comfortable. Moore was told he could leave any time he wanted to, take any breaks, smoke, or eat anything. Which he said he understood and wanted to continue to get this all over with.

At 1140 we began another interview into case number 970120073 dated 10/15/97 at 0232. This incident occurred at the Spring Valley Country Club at 23913 Wilmot Rd. In speaking to Moore, he indicated that this vehicle is the very first vehicle they burned. He described the vehicle as a Ford LTD station wagon with Brown wood sides. The vehicle was for sale.

Moore said that he was with Al Dunski Jr. and Renee Thuemmler who drove them in her White Mustang. They were coming from Classic Billiards which is located in Kenosha on 22nd Ave., and 75th Street. A couple of days before they burned the station wagon. Moore said that, Dunski and Moore were in Dunski's truck and saw the vehicle for sale. Dunski said, that it was a while since they have had a car fire. Then the night they burned the vehicle, Dunski told Moore that tonight we're going to get that car.

Renee dropped them off at a bar called Extra Innings. Extra Innings, is also known as Furlan's Dugout to some people. Renee needed to get some cigarettes so she drove off towards Antioch. Moore and Dunski pretended to go towards the tavern, but instead stopped on the South side of the building where Dunski pulled out a spark plug, and a 4" red flare. Moore took the spark plug and broke the porcelain off it.

They ran across STH 83 towards the East, then ran North along the ditch line of the cemetery to Spring Valley Country Club. There parked and for sale was a Ford LTD station wagon with wood sides. Moore ran towards the right front passenger door and threw a handful of porcelain at the window, which immediately spidered. Moore started running back towards Extra Innings, and could hear Dunski clearing out glass, which dropped on the front seat. Moore heard 2 to 3 strikes of the tip of a flare. They ran back towards Extra Innings. When he saw Dunski running back, Dunski said that sucker is going. As they ran across the road, Renee was coming back from the South to pick them up.

Renee drove them South on STH 83 back to Moore's house. As they entered the driveway, they heard Trevor Fire being dispatched to a fire over a radio that Dunski had with him. I asked Moore to describe the radio to me. He said it was a Motorola 6 channel radio. Moore said the radio Dunski had is from the Silver Lake Fire Department. I asked Moore, if Dunski ever said when he got the radio, and all Moore knew was that Dunski said he got the radio the night of the Silver Lake fire. I asked if he said, anything about if it was before the fire, during the fire, or while fighting the fire, and he said that Dunski never said for sure, other than he got the radio from the Silver Lake Fire Department. I asked Moore to describe any markings, or identifying characteristic's on the radio. He said it has red tape on the right side. I used my department radio to have him describe where the tape was. He indicated the radio had Red tape around the top of the antenna and he wasn't sure, but Red tape either on the right side or around the body of the radio. I asked Moore if he could identify the radio again if he ever saw it again, and he could.



At the Trevor Fire Department, they responded in squad 6411. Neal Fisher, Chuck Tess, Dunski, and Moore responded in the squad. Moore indicated that he fought the fire from the right passenger side. The only windows in tact, was the windshield and the right rear side window of the station wagon.

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Moore indicated that while at the scene of the fire, he got into an argument with Deputy Tim Krueger 127. The argument was about the windows being broken. Deputy Krueger wanted to know who broke the windows and why. Moore said, the fire breaks the windows. Deputy Krueger said, how do I know you didn't do it with the nozzle? Moore said, how do I know you didn't do it with your flash light? Right then, a Dunkin Doughnut's truck was going by, and Chuck Tess told him, There goes your back up! and everyone started laughing. Chief Seep, told them to quit messing with the cop.

Moore said, that Dunski started crawling through the car, like he was doing his own investigation. Dunski told Krueger and a new deputy, that the fire started in the back of the station wagon. When they were fighting the fire, Dunski forced open some of the doors, but Moore didn't know which ones.

Moore said, he never told anyone about the fires, or that they had done them. A couple of days after this fire, Dunski and Moore were talking, and Dunski said it was weird, how it burned the back seat, and that it was still in tack. Dunski said that he threw the flare in the back seat. Moore didn't know how the fire started, but the vehicle was gutted. They never discussed the fire with Renee.

Moore said he didn't know the owner(s), they didn't ask him to set the 1989 Ford LTD, Station Wagon on fire. No one else asked them to except Dunski. Moore said he did the fire with Dunski, because they wanted to know how it burned, how it started, see it burn, and got to go to the fire in the fire truck. I asked if getting to go to the fire in the fire truck did anything for him, like hearing the siren or seeing the lights. All he said was no nothing like that, it was just being able to go to the fire. See attached statement. This interview and statement ended at 1325.


We took a break and Moore smoked a cigarette out side. Moore indicated that he would like to go to work soon, so I asked if we could just talk about the rest and take a written statement from him later. He said that would be fine.

We continued with the interview. I asked him about the Silver Lake Fire Department Fire. 970101526 dated 09/01/97 at 0342. Moore said that when Trevor Fire Department responded to the fire, and arrived at Silver Lake Fire Department, there was a train going through that blocked their way for a while.

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There was quite a few people already on scene. He indicated that Al Dunski was waving them to the West side of the fire department. Also there was Silver Lake Fire Chief, Chief Tanski and assistant Chief Zimmer and a long haired guy, who drives an old white cop motorcycle was already there along with a couple of more people, he didn't know.

Dunski was trying to direct the trucks. I asked Moore how long he has known Dunski. He said that prior to the Silver Lake Fire, he had only seen Dunski once or twice. He never actually knew Dunski.

The day of the Silver Lake Fire Department fire, Dunski had a radio, but the radio he had didn't have any red tape on it. I asked him if he ever asked Dunski where he got the radio with the red tape on it, and Dunski told him that he got it the night of the Silver Lake Fire, from the Fire Department. That radio was always with Dunski since the first time Moore met Dunski, which was about one month before Dunski joined Trevor fire.

I stopped the interview and went and got the radio I recovered from Bob Greenough Sr. When I showed Moore the radio he loudly said that's the radio, how did you get it. We didn't talk about that, but continued with Moore telling me, that Moore is the one who disabled the radio.

Moore said that Dunski had taken a crystal out of Moore's fire department pager and when Moore found out that his pager wasn't working, he confronted Dunski about it, and Dunski told Moore, that he took the crystal.


Knowing Dunski took Moore's pager crystal. Dunski had left the radio at Greenough's house and Moore found it, and disabled the radio, by taking out and throwing away a couple of screws. He said, that he also took out what he called a brain chip and diaphragm that folds out of the radio. Moore said he ripped it out and threw them into the garbage.

We also spoke about the Cadi/Lincoln fire. He indicated that it took 4 times to get that vehicle going on fire. First Dunski used only a flare but it went out. They returned with lighter fluid and that didn't work. They returned a third time with gasoline and it went out again. Then the last time they returned with lighter fluid and gas, and left the door ajar so air would get in, and it finally got going.

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The last thing we talked about was a couch that Moore and someone named Jamie Waters set on fire near Trevor Fire Chief Tom Seep's house. He said that Waters soaked the couch with lighter fluid and Moore flicked cigarette's at the couch until it started on fire. I asked why they did this and Moore said that Jamie was mad at the home owner for something.

We ended the interview at 1400. I took Moore to work in Libertyville. On the way, we stopped at the McDonald's on STH 50, just West of I 94 and I bought Moore something to eat. Enroute to Moore's work Moore made a comment that Dunski had once told him that, the less people involved in setting the fire's, the less chance of getting in trouble.

On the way back to Kenosha I stopped by Trevor Fire Department and Chief Seep provided me with a copy of their fire call list from 01/04/97 to 12/29/97. See attached. I went over with it to see what was the date of the couch fire, and it was 10/04/97 at 0109. I will be checking to see if there is a Kenosha Sheriff's Department case number for that call and putting it in a follow up report.

On Thursday 09/24/98 I went to [REDACTED], to speak to Dennis M. Bowman.

I spoke to Bowman in regards to him talking to people and telling them that Moore and Dunski have been setting fires. I asked him if he had first hand information to this from either of the suspects and he didn't. Everything he knew about was only rumor he had heard. I asked him specifically about him making a statement about the fire at CTH C and STH 83 in which it was alleged that Bowman had told another fire fighter that "do you remember the fire at C & 83, well Moore and Dunski Jr. set the car on fire." He said that he may have said

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At the house Bob Greenough Sr., and Mrs. Greenough were in bed asleep. They all watched video's till they started falling asleep. Don McCoy fell asleep around 0100, Dennis Bowman fell asleep around 0100-0200, and Bowman heard that Bob Greenough fell asleep around 0300, but he didn't know for sure. When the Trevor Fire Department pager went off for the fire by Dexter Moore's house, everyone was still there. Moore and Dunski were asleep on the couch. Bowman never saw anyone leave or come in while they were at the house. I asked Bowman if he knew who's pager(s), went off and he wasn't sure, he thought Bob Jr., and Bob Sr., and possibly Moore's pager. But he wasn't sure.

I asked who responded to the fire in what vehicles. He wasn't sure, but Dennis went with Bob Jr. and Bob Sr. in their vehicle, he wasn't sure who Moore went with, but Dunski took his truck.

I asked Bowman if he was aware of or had any direct knowledge of any fire fighters in Kenosha County setting fires. He said no and that he would help in any way he could to get anyone who is doing anything like that. I asked him what if anything Dexter Moore said to him after leaving Probation and Parole Tuesday. All Moore told him was that he had a lot to do there, and that because he was at the Silver Lake Fire, we wanted to talk to him about the Silver Lake Fire Department fire. I gave Bowman a card to contact me if he hears anything more in reference to any of the fire's or fire fighters setting fire's in Kenosha County.

I went to [REDACTED] the residence of Renee A. Thuemmler. There was a White Mustang with Wisconsin registration TMW354 sitting in the driveway. I ran the plate, and it came back to Renee A. Thuemmler on a 1988 Ford Mustang, VIN: 1FABP41A2JF136072.

I went to the residence and knocked on the door and rang the bell, however no one would answer or respond. See attached TTY.


On Friday 09/25/98 I made phone contact with Michael J. Bull at his place of employment. In speaking to him I told him I wouldn't take up much of his time at work, but would request that he make some detail notes of anything he did or saw on the night before the fire at Silver Lake Fire Department.

In speaking to him on the phone he indicated that on Sunday 08/31/97 he had just returned from Las Vegas with Mike Stoxten. They had just come into town and stopped at the fire station around 1900 or 1930. Already at the fire station was, Rich Maron (Hollywood), and Al Bryner. They were watching TV and talking

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about Las Vegas. Bull also went through the fire trucks to check the hand held radio's. There is one radio that he had to charge, because it won't hold a charge and needed a new battery so he put it in the charge.

I asked if he knew what brand the radio was or what their hand held radios are, and he didn't he said to check either with Guy Lumpert, or Chief Dan Tanski. All the Officers on the fire department have their own hand held radio's assigned to them. Lumpert and Tanski should be able to account for every radio the department had.

I asked if he knew of any problems in the building with any of the equipment, vehicles, or electronic's. He said other than the radio that didn't hold a charge nothing. I asked him to go through and note everything he saw, if possible do a diagram of where everything was sitting in the room when he was there, and if he had any photographs of the inside of the building or anyone else has any photo's of the inside of the building. I would appreciate if I could get them.

I asked when was their next department meeting and he indicate the first Thursday of the month. Which was going to be 10/01/98 and the officers meet first at 1830, then the rest of the fire department at 1900. Any of the old radio's turned in by the officers they were issued to are now being used and kept in the new vehicles.

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
